Mayor Gutierrez recognized Fleet Manager Chris Hernandez who gave a presentation on the FY2021-2022 Vehicle/Equipment replacement program.

Within each fiscal budget year, the Fleet Department requests to purchase vehicles/equipment to add to or replace aging vehicles to maintain a good working fleet of City owned vehicles/equipment for the 2021/2022 budget year and in accordance with the Vehicle Replacement Plan previously approved by Council.

The list included: emergency vehicles, light duty vehicles, and equipment to be purchased in FY2021-22. The vehicles/equipment will be purchased from various vendors via group purchasing cooperatives and/or sole source vendors. Each group purchasing cooperative contract was competitively bid by the awarding entity. In addition to that level of competition, City staff also obtained multiple contract quotes to ensure the overall best value for the City was obtained.

Total FY2021-22 Replacement List has 31 assets that will be replaced this October 2021. The approx. cost is \$1,084,000.00 dollars.

Mayor Pro-Tem Dahle asked if the vehicles are replaced by age or repair history. They are replaced by age.

Councilmember Whittaker drove around Schertz near Lookout Rd and looked at the businesses with office space and with warehouse distribution centers. She is in favor of this development.

Mayor Gutierrez recognized Finance Director James Walters who explained that a budget adjustment is needed for Fire Employee Personnel Costs. Without this adjustment, this line item will be short funded. Also, \$125,000.00 is being transferred from Water and Sewer Administration for new meter purchases over to the Utility Billing Department. The Utility Billing Department will be responsible for purchasing meters, so the funding needed to be transferred to that department.

Mr. Walters also wanted to bring to Council's attention that at the Final Reading at the next council meeting, there may be an adjustment for the Woman Hollering Trunk-line. The contracts will be a ready to bring to Council next meeting and funding will be needed to initiate them. Staff will be requesting the budget adjustment to award the contract and begin the project.

Mayor Gutierrez opened up for Council Comments.

Mr. James stated that when an applicant is expanding their business, additional roadway capital recovery fees would be assessed. The roadway capital recovery fees are \$9310.00. The applicant states the roadway capital recovery fees are not applicable to them because they are a charter school. Mr. James indicated that the city staff does not agree with waiving the roadway capital recover fees and explained the appeal process to the applicant.

Mayor Gutierrez recognized Mr. Brian Dahlberg who represents the Responsive Education Solutions, who stated that under LGC § 395.022 (b) exempts school districts from paying impact fees. The project will include to add 8-10 classrooms and expand the cafeteria. Mr. Dahlberg stated with the school's 5013(c) non-profit, the Texas Supreme Court says with respect to their enrollment status, they are a governmental entity, a state public school and therefore exempt from paying impact fees.

Mayor Gutierrez stated the City Council reserves the right to go into closed session at any time during the course of this meeting to discuss any of the matters listed above, as authorized by the Texas Open Meetings Act. Under the Texas Government Code Chapter 551.071 the City Council has the right to confer and seek legal advice from city attorney concerning applicant's appeal of the roadway capital recovery fees.

Mayor Gutierrez recessed the regular meeting into Closed Session at 6:53 p.m.

Mayor Gutierrez reconvened back into regular session at 7:40 p.m.

BACKGROUND

The Great Northern Trail is a trail project that is planned to follow the high-line utility easement along Wiederstein Road and stretches approximately 8 miles from Schertz Parkway to the Cypress Point neighborhood in northern Schertz. The first section of this trail already exists in Forest Ridge Park and the second section is being built as part of the Schertz Pedestrian Routes & Bike Lanes Project to connect Schertz Parkway to Forest Ridge Park. The next section of trail city staff is focusing on is the connection from the existing trails in the Riata neighborhood to FM 1103 (near Cibolo Valley Baptist Church.) The design is completed on this section and staff has prepared the easement agreement (attached.) Once the easement agreement is executed, construction could begin later this fall/early winter.

GOAL

The goal is to secure this trail easement agreement with Cibolo Valley Baptist Church in order to construct a segment of the Great Northern Trail across the easement.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

The community will benefit by this trail easement agreement as it is a missing piece to the connectivity needed for the Great Northern Trail. Without this easement agreement there would be a significant gap in the trail system and further disconnect our northern residents.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approve Resolution 21-R-100.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact related to this easement agreement. Construction of the trail will have a fiscal impact and that will be brought to council in a separate item. Trail funding is set aside for this project in the Bond Funds designated for Parks & Trail Projects.

(the "Grantor"), for and in consideration of the sum of Ten and No/100 Dollars (\$10.00), the benefits which will accrue to the Grantor and to the public generally, and other good and valuable consideration to the Grantor paid by the CITY OF SCHERTZ, a Texas municipal corporation (the "Grantee"), the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, has GRANTED, SOLD, and CONVEYED and by these presents does GRANT, SELL, and CONVEY unto the Grantee, its successors and assigns, subject to the terms hereof, a permanent easement and right-of-way upon, across, and beneath real property located in Guadalupe County, Texas, as more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes (the "Easement"), and being a 0.376-acre portion of that tract of land of the Grantor more particularly described as being a portion of LOT 1, CIBOLO VALLEY BAPTIST CHURCH, as platted in Volume 7, Page 253, Map and Plat Records of Guadalupe County, Texas, being the same as a called 10.00 acre tract described in a deed to the Cibolo Valley Baptist Church, recorded in Volume 754, Page 805, of the Official Public Records of Guadalupe County, Texas (the "Premises"). The Easement is granted for the purpose of constructing, operating, maintaining, and repairing a trail (the "Trail"), together with free and unrestricted public pedestrian ingress and egress in, upon, and over the Easement.

The Easement herein granted is subject to the following terms, agreements, reservations, conditions, covenants, limitations, and exceptions:

- (1) The Easement herein granted shall be located across a 30-foot width strip of land per the attached Exhibit A and shall be perpetual until the earlier to occur of (a) the permanent and affirmative abandonment of the use of the Easement by the Grantee, its successors or assigns, or (b) the execution and recordation in the Official Public Records of Guadalupe County, Texas, of an instrument by which the Grantee, or its successors or assigns, as applicable, abandons and releases the Easement.
- (2) Neither the Grantor nor any successor owner of the Premises shall disturb, or otherwise interfere with the continued use of the Trail, nor shall any such persons erect or permit the erection of any buildings, slabs, structures, or other improvement within the boundaries of the Easement, or which would otherwise interfere with the Trail's continued use and maintenance. With respect to any buildings, slabs, structures, or other improvements encroaching on the Easement

as of the date of this Agreement, the Grantee shall have the right to remove such building, slab, structure, or improvement to allow for the construction, operation, maintenance, or repair of the Trail. To the extent that construction of the Trail results in the removal of brush from the Easement, the Grantee shall arrange for the disposal of the brush at the Grantee's sole cost and expense. Grantor shall remain responsible for the maintenance of the unimproved portions of the Easement. Should Grantor fail to maintain the easement, Grantee shall have the right to do so if in the Grantee's sole judgement, the maintenance is required to safely use the Trail.

- (3) The Easement herein granted shall run with the land and be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Grantor and the Grantee, and their respective successors, assigns, and legal representatives, and shall be binding upon all parties having or acquiring any right, title or interest in the Premises or any portion thereof.
- (4) Should it become necessary at any time subsequent to completion to the construction of the Trail for the Grantee to enter the Grantor's Premises for the purpose of maintaining, repairing, operation, or altering the Trail in any way, the Grantee shall, after each entry upon the Premises, leave the Premises substantially in the same condition that it was in prior to such entry to the full extent reasonably practicable. If any repair or replacement activities become necessary as a result of the acts, omissions, or negligence of the owner or owners of the Premises or any of their tenants, or any of such persons' respective agents, employees, licensees, or invitees, then such owner or owners shall be responsible for promptly performing, at their sole cost and expenses, all necessary repairs, and, if they fail to do so, the Grantee (or its successors or assigns, as applicable) shall be entitled to do so and to recover all reasonable costs therefore from the owner or owners (jointly and severally) of the Premises.

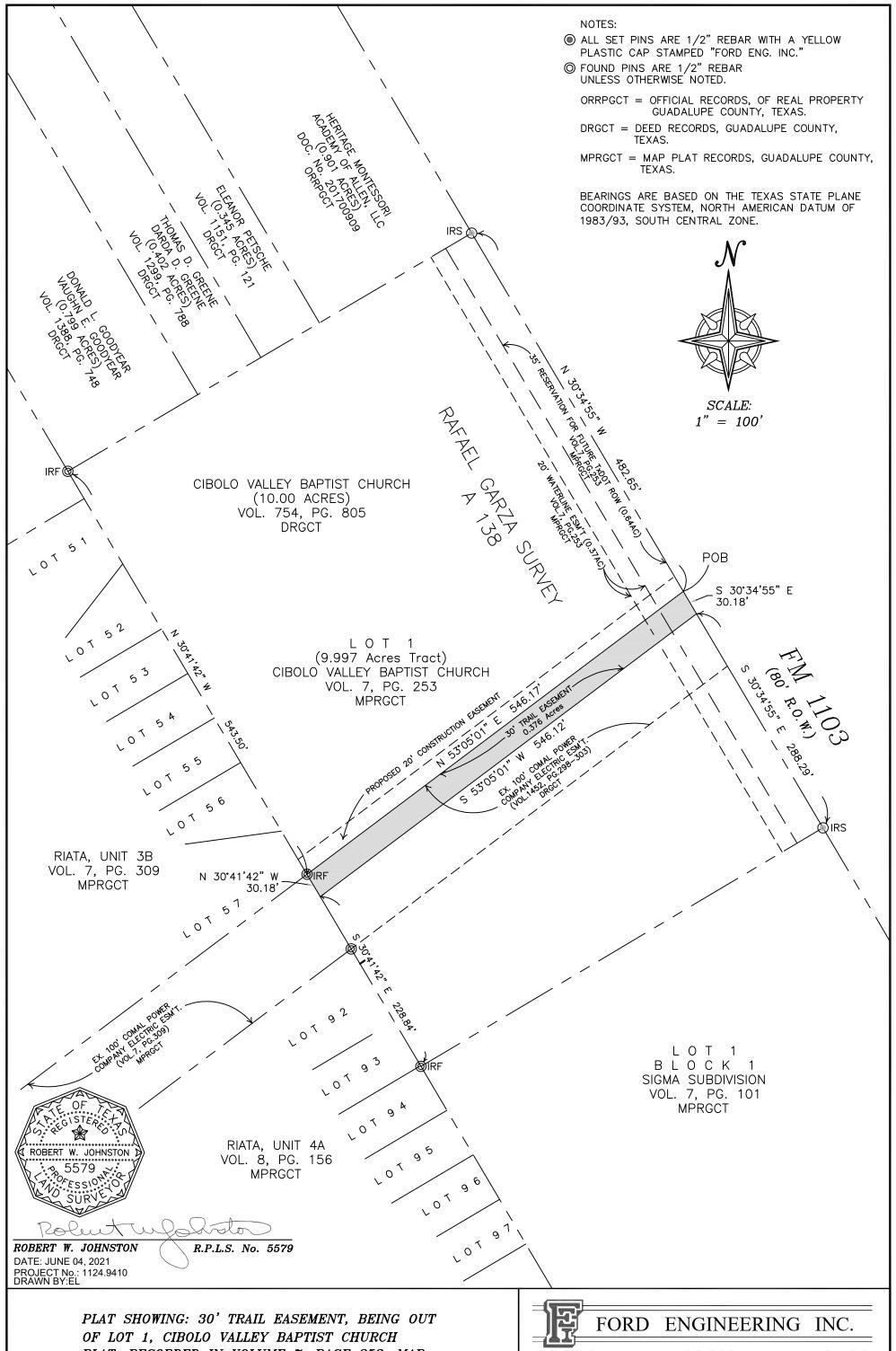

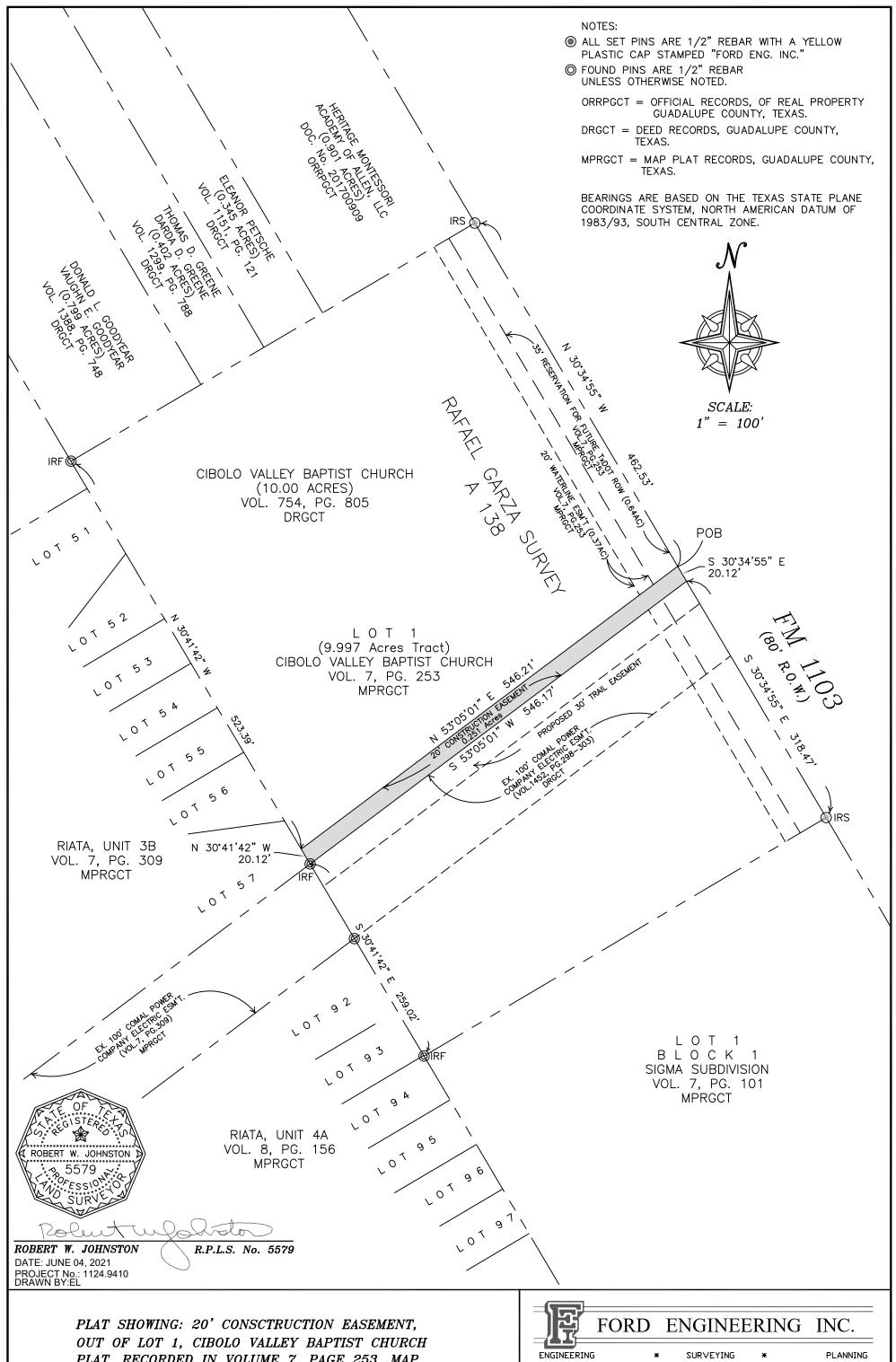

City Council of the City of Schertz, Texas authorizing a contract with Intermountain Slurry Seal for the 2020 SPAM Resurfacing Project and authorizing the budget expenditures for the project. (B. James/J. Nowak)

BACKGROUND

The 2020 SPAM Resurfacing Project is a continuation of the City's comprehensive pavement preservation effort that began last year. The project's goals are to perform the necessary prep work to various city streets, then apply a new driving surface to them. For this project, slurry seal is being added on top of the road. A slurry seal is a thick mixture of sand and oil that is spread onto the street surface. The oil/sand mixture seals the surface of the street, rejuvenates the existing pavement, and provides a new wearing surface for vehicles to drive on.

When the project was originally scoped, more streets were included in the slurry seal list. As the project was designed, it was discovered that the project budget was not sufficient to provide for slurry sealing all the originally intended streets. As a result, the project scope was modified to select the streets in the original project area that needed the slurry seal application now, instead of some that could wait for a future project. The streets that would not be able to receive a slurry seal with this project effort, will instead be crack sealed. Crack sealing these streets will help preserve them and save some effort for the future resurfacing project. The project also includes applying a slurry seal on top of the chip seal applied last year in The Estates at Wilson's Preserve. The other areas that were chip sealed last year will receive a fog seal on top of the chip seal via a separate contract. We did not receive any bids for the fog seal contract when we advertised for bids last month. The fog seal contract is being re-bid now.

Two bids were received on September 8, 2021, for the project. The bids ranged from a low of \$2,056,151.23 to a high of \$2,745,202.43. The low bid received was below the Engineer's Estimate for the project. Selection of the best bid was based primarily on cost. All bidders were required to submit additional information, such as experience on similar projects; experience on public projects; available resources to complete the project; corporate history and stability; and references. The additional information was used to verify the bidders were capable of completing the project. Based on the information provided, all bidders are capable of completing the project work. The lowest bid received for was from Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc. The Engineer (Kimley-Horn Associates) has reviewed the bids, checked references, and verified the additional information provided for the bid and recommends award for the construction contract to Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc. Staff concurs with the Engineer's recommendation.

A construction contract awarded to Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc. would perform prep work and apply a slurry seal to streets in The Estates at Wilson's Preserve, and the other blue highlighted streets in the attached maps. The green highlighted streets in the attached maps will be crack sealed. The street prep work is expected to begin in November and will take a few months to complete. The slurry seal application is expected to occur in April or May of 2022.

GOAL

To obtain authorization from City Council to execute a construction contract with Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc. for \$2,056,151.23, and a not to exceed amount of \$2,153,000, for the 2020 SPAM Resurfacing Project.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

The project will perform prep work (base repairs, crack seal, minor asphalt leveling, etc.) and apply a slurry seal to various city streets. The project will also crack seal various city streets. The crack sealing will help prevent moisture from getting into the base, reducing the chances of developing potholes or base failures in the streets. The other prep work and slurry seal application will preserve the existing street section and provide a new driving surface to the streets.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Authorize execution of the construction contract for the 2020 SPAM Resurfacing Project to Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc., for \$2,056,151.23 and a not to exceed amount of \$2,153,000.00.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for the project will come from excess Certificates of Obligation Bond Funds for streets and from Excess General Fund Reserves allocated to streets (SPAM).

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends Council approve Resolution 21-R-105 and authorize award of the bid for the 2020 SPAM Resurfacing Project to Intermountain Slurry Seal for \$2,056,151.23 and a not to exceed amount of \$2,153,000.00.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN OWNER AND CONTRACTOR FOR CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT (STIPULATED PRICE)

Owner and Contractor hereby agree as	follows:	

ARTICLE 1 – WORK

1.01 Contractor shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows:

ARTICLE 2 – THE PROJECT

2.01 The Project, of which the Work under the Contract Documents is a part, is generally described as follows: Elbel Storm Drain and Overlay

ARTICLE 3 – ENGINEER

- 3.01 The part of the Project that pertains to the Work has been designed by <u>Kimley-Horn and</u> Associates, Inc.
- 3.02 The Owner has retained the City of Schertz Engineering Department ("Engineer") to act as Owner's representative, assume all duties and responsibilities, and have the rights and authority assigned to Engineer in the Contract Documents in connection with the completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 4 – CONTRACT TIMES

- 4.01 Time of the Essence
 - A. All time limits for Milestones, if any, Substantial Completion, and completion and readiness for final payment as stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence of the Contract. Contract Times: Days
 - B. The Work is expected to be substantially completed within 300 calendar days after the date when the Contract Times commence to run as provided in Paragraph 4.01 of the General Conditions, and completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions within 30 calendar days after the date of substantial completion.

4.02 Liquidated Damages

A. Contractor and Owner recognize that time is of the essence as stated in Paragraph 4.01 above and that Owner will suffer financial and other losses if the Work is not completed and Milestones not achieved within the times specified in Paragraph 4.02 above, plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with the Contract. The Contractor acknowledges and recognizes that the Owner is entitled to full and beneficial occupancy and use of the completed work following expiration of the Contract Time. The Contractor further acknowledges and agrees that, if the Contractor fails to substantially, or cause the Substantial Completion of any portion of the Work within the Contract time, the Owner will

sustain actual damages as a result of such failure. The exact amount of such damages will be difficult to ascertain. Therefore, the Owner and Contractor agree that, if the Contractor shall neglect, fail, or refuse to achieve substantial completion of the Work by the Substantial Completion date, subject to proper extension granted by the Owner, then the Contractor agrees to pay the Owner the sum of:

Six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per day for each day in which such Work is not completed, not as penalty, but as liquidated damages, for the damages ("Liquidated Damages") that would be suffered by Owner as a result of delay for each and every calendar day that the Contractor shall have failed to have completed the Work as required herein. The Liquidated Damages shall be in lieu of any and all other damages which may be incurred by Owner as a result of the failure of Contractor to complete within the Contract Time.

ARTICLE 5 – CONTRACT PRICE

- 5.01 Owner shall pay Contractor for completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents the amounts that follow, subject to adjustment under the Contract:
 - A. For all Unit Price Work, an amount equal to the sum of the extended prices (established for each separately identified item of Unit Price Work by multiplying the unit price times the actual quantity of that item):

The extended prices for Unit Price Work set forth as of the Effective Date of the Contract are based on estimated quantities. As provided in Paragraph 13.03 of the General Conditions, estimated quantities are not guaranteed, and determinations of actual quantities and classifications are to be made by Engineer.

ARTICLE 6 – PAYMENT PROCEDURES

6.01 Submittal and Processing of Payments

A. Contractor shall submit Applications for Payment in accordance with Article 15 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed by Engineer as provided in the General Conditions.

6.02 Progress Payments; Retainage

A. Owner shall make progress payments on account of the Contract Price on the basis of Contractor's Applications for Payment on or about the 30th day of each month during performance of the Work as provided in Paragraph 6.02.A.1 below, provided that such Applications for Payment have been submitted in a timely manner and otherwise meet the

requirements of the Contract. All such payments will be measured by the Schedule of Values established as provided in the General Conditions (and in the case of Unit Price Work based on the number of units completed) or, in the event there is no Schedule of Values, as provided elsewhere in the Contract.

- Prior to Substantial Completion, progress payments will be made in an amount equal
 to the percentage indicated below but, in each case, less the aggregate of payments
 previously made and less such amounts as Owner may withhold, including but not
 limited to liquidated damages, in accordance with the Contract
 - a. 95 percent of Work completed (with the balance being retainage); and
 - b. <u>95</u> percent of cost of materials and equipment not incorporated in the Work (with the balance being retainage).
- B. Upon Substantial Completion, Owner shall pay an amount sufficient to increase total payments to Contractor to the full amount of the contract, less such amounts set off by Owner pursuant to Paragraph 15.01.E of the General Conditions, and less such amounts as the Engineer shall determine for incomplete Work, retainage applicable to such work and unsettled claims.

6.03 Final Payment

A. Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions, Owner shall pay the remainder of the Contract Price as recommended by Engineer as provided in said Paragraph 15.06.

ARTICLE 7 – INTEREST

7.01 All amounts not paid when due shall bear interest at the maximum rate allowed by law, not to exceed 1% per month.

ARTICLE 8 – CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

- 8.01 In order to induce Owner to enter into this Contract, Contractor makes the following representations:
 - A. Contractor has examined and carefully studied the Contract Documents, and any data and reference items identified in the Contract Documents.
 - B. Contractor has visited the Site, conducted a thorough, alert visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with and is satisfied as to the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
 - C. Contractor is familiar with and is satisfied as to all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
 - D. Contractor has carefully studied all: (1) reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and all drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings, and (2) reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.

- E. Contractor has considered the information known to Contractor itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Contract Documents; and the Site-related reports and drawings identified in the Contract Documents, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and documents on (1) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (2) the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Contractor; and (3) Contractor's safety precautions and programs.
- F. Based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, Contractor agrees that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract.
- G. Contractor is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Contract Documents.
- H. Contractor has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Contractor has discovered in the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Contractor.
- I. The Contract Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.
- J. Contractor's entry into this Contract constitutes an incontrovertible representation by Contractor that without exception all prices in the Agreement are premised upon performing and furnishing the Work required by the Contract Documents.

 - a. Notice to Proceed.

- b. Work Change Directives.
- c. Change Orders.
- d. Field Orders.
- B. The documents listed in Paragraph 9.01.A are attached to this Agreement (except as expressly noted otherwise above).
- C. There are no Contract Documents other than those listed above in this Article 9.

ARTICLE 10 – MISCELLANEOUS

10.01 Terms

A. Terms used in this Agreement will have the meanings stated in the General Conditions and the Supplementary Conditions.

10.02 Assignment of Contract

A. Unless expressly agreed to elsewhere in the Contract, no assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and, specifically but without limitation, money that may become due and money that is due may not be assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents.

10.03 Successors and Assigns

A. Owner and Contractor each binds itself, its successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the other party hereto, its successors, assigns, and legal representatives in respect to all covenants, agreements, and obligations contained in the Contract Documents.

10.04 Severability

A. Any provision or part of the Contract Documents held to be void or unenforceable under any Law or Regulation shall be deemed stricken, and all remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and binding upon Owner and Contractor, who agree that the Contract Documents shall be reformed to replace such stricken provision or part thereof with a valid and enforceable provision that comes as close as possible to expressing the intention of the stricken provision.

10.05 Contractor's Certifications

- A. Contractor certifies that it has not engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for or in executing the Contract. For the purposes of this Paragraph 10.05:
 - "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value likely to influence the action of a public official in the bidding process or in the Contract execution;
 - 2. "fraudulent practice" means an intentional misrepresentation of facts made (a) to influence the bidding process or the execution of the Contract to the detriment of

- Owner, (b) to establish Bid or Contract prices at artificial non-competitive levels, or (c) to deprive Owner of the benefits of free and open competition;
- 3. "collusive practice" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of Owner, a purpose of which is to establish Bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels; and
- "coercive practice" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the bidding process or affect the execution of the Contract.

10.06 Other Provisions

A. Owner stipulates that if the General Conditions that are made a part of this Contract are based on EJCDC® C-700, Standard General Conditions for the Construction Contract, published by the Engineers Joint Contract Documents Committee®, and if Owner is the party that has furnished said General Conditions, then Owner has plainly shown all modifications to the standard wording of such published document to the Contractor, through a process such as highlighting or "track changes" (redline/strikeout), or in the Supplementary Conditions.

On Wednesday, September 8, 2021, Contractor bids were submitted for the above referenced contract. In total, two (2) Contractors submitted on this contract. The following summary represents the bidders and their total contract bid with the Engineer's opinion of probable construction cost (OPCC), in sequential order from lowest to highest:

1.	Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc	\$2,056,151.23
2.	Engineer OPCC	\$2,153,213.00
3.	Viking Construction, Inc	\$2,745,202.43

The bid format for this contract is Low Bid. Kimley-Horn reviewed the unit prices bid by each Contractor and each bid is considered responsive based on the review of unit prices alone. The lowest responsive bidder for this contract is Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc. with a total contract bid of \$2,056,151.23. Intermountain Slurry Seal is a regional contractor and has completed numerous preservation type projects across the southern United States. Kimley-Horn reviewed the 5-year's past project list provided by Intermountain Slurry Seal and they list numerous Slurry and Micro-Surface type (street preservation) projects as part of their resume. One of these projects is San Antonio Micro Package 2 with the City of San Antonio, completed in 2019. Kimley-Horn contacted the current Preservation Program Manager with the City of San Antonio to confirm qualifications and scope of work, and this outreach yielded positive feedback. In addition to the project completed in 2019, Intermountain Slurry Seal successfully completed additional preservation type contracts in 2021 for the City of San Antonio.

Based on Kimley-Horn's review of the unit bid prices, project experience list, and confirmation of scope and qualifications with listed references, Kimley-Horn recommends award of this contract to Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc.



Attached with this contract award recommendation is a complete bid tabulation of all submitted bids and a bid comparison between Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc. and the Engineer's OPCC. Intermountain Slurry Seal's bid is 14.4% lower than the responsive Contractor average and 4.5% lower than the Engineer's OPCC.

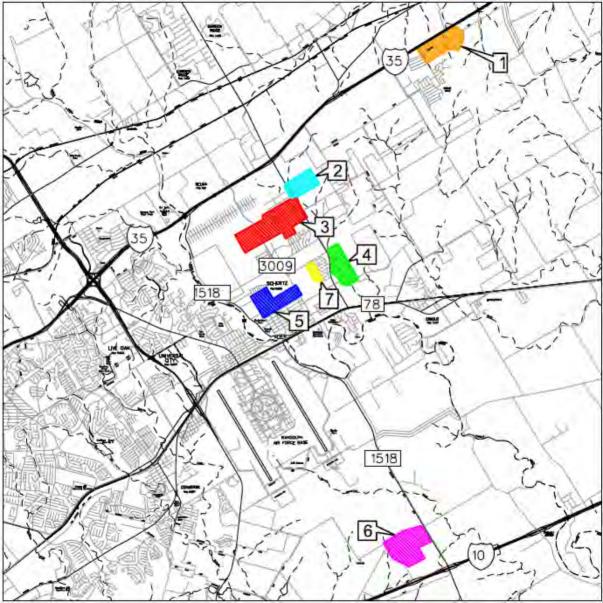

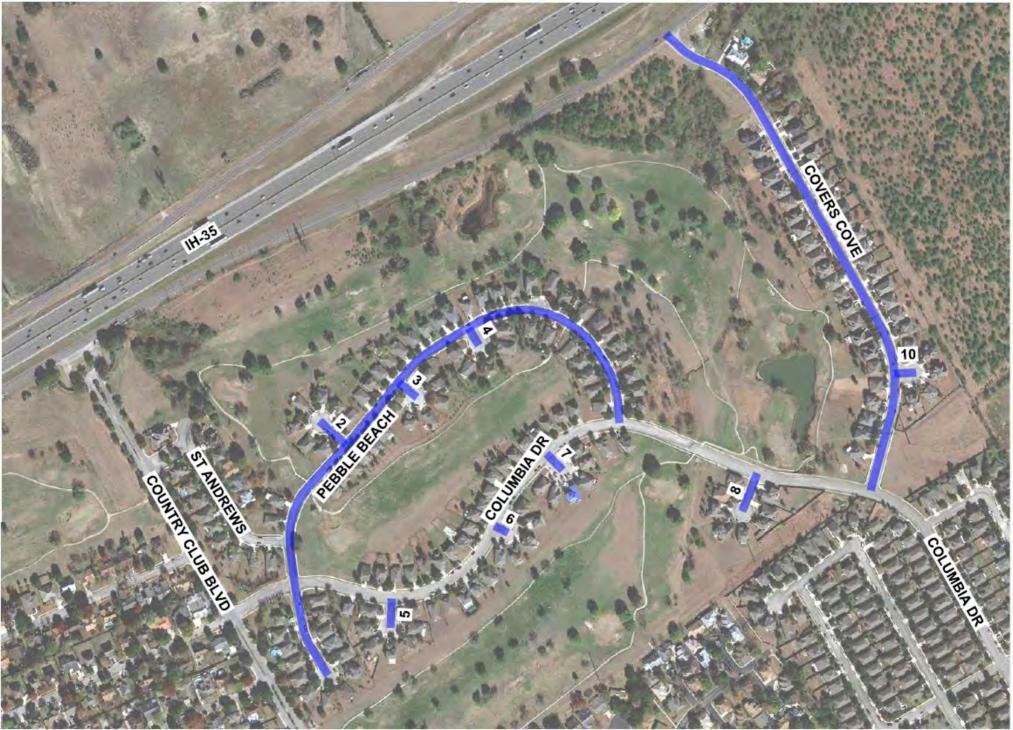

BACKGROUND

In the EMS, Utility Billing, and Magazine functions, services are provided to customers up front and billing is settled later. Since services are provided before receiving payment, inevitably the City has customers that do not pay for the services provided.

When this occurs, staff reaches out to the customer to try to collect the outstanding payment including follow-up notices and phone calls to try to reach out to the customer to remind them of the outstanding balance and encourage payment. However, the longer the customer account goes without a payment the less likely that any payment will be received.

Once a customer account reaches 180 days without payment, Staff brings those accounts to the City Council to be "written off". This process is an accounting procedure following the Generally Accepted Accounted Principles (GAAP), which lays the framework of accounting practices in the U.S. This designation means it is unlikely those outstanding balances will ever be collected. This leads to an accounting adjustment on the City's Financial Statements to accurately show how much is still outstanding and is reasonable to expect collection.

If a customer's account has been written off, this does not erase or forgive that debt. The city can and does collect some portion of the amount owed by those customers. This can be through the debt collection agency used by EMS or if the customer returns to the City and requests new services through the Magazine or Utility Billing.

On August 27, 2019, City Council approved the Schertz EMS Charity Care Policy. Approving the Charity Care Policy benefits our citizens who do not have insurance and do not have the ability to pay for ambulance services. In the past, these accounts were sent to collections and written off throughout year with little expectation to recover any revenue.

The resolution authorizes the debt for these areas that is more than 180 days outstanding as of September 1, 2021, to be written off. These write-offs come before council quarterly and last came before council on June 22, 2021.

Charity Care for March 2021 was for an entire year, August 2019 through July 2020. For June 2021, Charity Care was for 5 months, August 2020 through December 2021. Going forward, these adjustments will be done quarterly.

GOAL

To approve write-offs of bad debt in accordance with the standards laid out by GAAP.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

This will show the City's Financial Statements according to national standards and City policy.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approve Resolution No. 21-R-101 to write off receivables that are older than 180 days.

FISCAL IMPACT

This accounting adjustment will not affect the City's Budget or financial standing. The amount written off is estimated during the budget process and is accounted for in the revenue estimations and the bad debt expense accounts. The action taken tonight will reduce the amount shown as owed to the City by \$750,502.47 and set it equal to the amount seen as still reasonably collectible. The breakdown is as follows:

BACKGROUND

The Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) updated and consolidated the number of licenses and permits they offer from 75 in 2019 to 37 as of September 1, 2021. When the City of Schertz updated the Fee Schedule on September 14, 2021, the TABC License/Permit Types: Wine and Malt Beverage Retailer's Permit (BG) and (Malt Beverage) Retail Dealer's Off-Premise License (BE), it did not include the different fees associated with these License/Permit Types, as to which county the business resides in.

GOAL

To update the Schertz Fee Schedule with the Malt Beverage Retailer's Permit (BG) and (Malt Beverage) Retail Dealer's Off-Premise License (BE) and the local fees associated with each license.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

The Schertz Fee Schedule will be updated and show the correct TABC Licenses/Permit Fees and the local Fees that the City of Schertz can collect from businesses selling alcoholic beverages within the city limits.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends council approve the proposed updates to the fees schedule.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fee changes will affect the General Fund with the collection of the correct local fees allowed by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 21-R-110

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS UPDATING THE FEE SCHEDULE FOR FY 2021-22, AND OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, the City of Schertz (the "City") has established by ordinances and resolutions for fees for licenses, permits, and services provided by the City; and

WHEREAS, due to the need for periodic modification of said fees and for the purposes of efficiency, the City Council desires to adopt future fee changes by resolution rather than by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) License/Permit Type: Wine and Malt Beverage Retailer's Permit (**BG**) previously known as the Wine and Beer Retailer's Permit and (Malt Beverage) Retail Dealer's Off-Premise License (**BE**) have different fees for Original and Renewal Licenses; and different fees depending on which county the business is located in; and

WHEREAS, the Schedule of Fees attached as <u>Exhibit A</u> reflects revisions to certain fees, a restatement of certain fees not revised, and a consolidation of all such fees; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to update the fee schedule.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS THAT:

- Section 1. The City Council amends the FY 2021-22 Fee Schedule to update the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission License/Permit Types as reflected in Exhibit A.
- Section 2. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.
- Section 3. All resolutions, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.
- Section 4. This Resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.
- Section 5. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City Council hereby declares that this Resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

Section 6. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Resolution, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended.

Section 7. This Resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so resolved.

Playscape and Pavilion. (B. James/L. Shrum)

BACKGROUND

Phase 1 Renovations:

In FY18-19 the city-funded \$160,000 in Phase 1 renovations at Ashley Park. Due to the limited amount of funding available and the long list of deferred maintenance projects, the city had to divide up the improvements over the course of 3 years. First up, the failing asphalt basketball court was demolished and a new concrete court with acrylic coating was constructed. The existing playscape feature was past its useful life and was replaced with a new double-pyramid net climbing structure, a new swing set with expression swing, and a gaga ball pit. A cosmetic update was completed at the restroom facility, an accessible water fountain with a dog bowl was added, new trash cans and benches were added, and a new accessible route from the street to the playscape was added.

Phase 2 Renovations:

In FY19-20 the city-funded an additional \$79,000 for Phase 2 of improvements at Ashley Park for the new fully accessible concrete loop trail. The existing asphalt trail was failing and there were some sections where the cross slope did not meet accessibility requirements. There was also no accessible route to the toddler playscape structure nor to any of the picnic tables. The concrete loop trail included an extension to the toddler playground as well as one of the picnic tables. Due to scheduling issues and delays from the COVID-19 pandemic, the work wasn't completed until March of 2021.

Phase 3 Renovations:

In FY20-21, Phase 3 improvements include an additional playscape feature and picnic pavilion at a cost of \$110,917.19 to complete the renovations at Ashley Park. The picnic pavilion will be available for reservations for birthday parties and will meet some of the demand for additional park pavilions in the city. The playscape feature was added in Phase 3 due to the feedback we received from residents after Phase 1 improvements were completed, where it was noted that a slide was an important component of the old structure and residents wanted to see a slide back in the new features. A postcard was sent out to area residents directing them to an online poll to choose the new playscape feature from 4 different options, and Option 3 was the winner - the Beacon's Bay unit with an integrated shade structure.

GOAL

The goal is to construct an additional picnic pavilion that is available for reservation for birthday parties and other gatherings and fill some of the need for additional picnic pavilions in the city. Additionally, city staff is responding to resident feedback by bringing back a slide feature in the playscape.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

The community will benefit from the additional picnic pavilion as we get more requests for rental availability than we have the capability for. Additionally, the surrounding neighborhoods will benefit from the enhanced park with new features and full accessibility.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approve Resolution 21-R-99.

FISCAL IMPACT

The cost of Phase III improvements to Ashley Park are \$110,917.19 and are funded out of Park & Recreation's regular FY 20-21 budget.

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES IN EXCESS OF \$50,000 WITH T.F. HARPER & ASSOCIATES, A BUYBOARD PURCHASING COOPERATIVE VENDOR, AND AUTHORIZING A PURCHASE TOTALING \$110,917.19 FOR THE ASHLEY PARK PLAYSCAPE AND PAVILION.

WHEREAS, city staff phased improvements at Ashley Park over the last three years and Phase III includes a picnic pavilion and playscape feature; and

WHEREAS, city staff gathered resident feedback on the playscape feature via resident voting on an online poll; and

WHEREAS, city staff worked with T.F. Harper & Associates, a BuyBoard vendor to provide cost estimates and a formal quote for the playscape structure, picnic pavilion, and installation costs; and

WHEREAS, the city has a policy to seek authorization for purchases in excess of \$50,000 with a single vendor and the BuyBoard quote totals \$110,917.19; and

WHEREAS, the BuyBoard National Purchasing Cooperative is a national online purchasing cooperative formed between the National School Boards Association and several state school boards associations, developed to comply with state laws which require government entities to make purchases through a competitive procurement process; and

WHEREAS, BuyBoard gives public entities the advantage of leveraging the cooperative's ability to obtain bulk discounts, combined with the ease of online, web-based shopping and ordering; and

WHEREAS, purchases under the cooperative programs meet the requirements under the Texas Local Government Purchasing Code rule for cooperative purchases as adopted by the City of Schertz Resolution 11-R-41 on August 30, 2011 amending the City's purchasing policy.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS THAT:

- Section 1. The City Council hereby authorizes the expenditures in excess of \$50,000 with T.F. Harper & Associates and authorizes the purchase of \$110,917.19 for the Ashley Park playscape and pavilion (in attached Exhibit A.)
- Section 2. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.

- Section 3. All resolutions, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.
- Section 4. This Resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.
- Section 5. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City Council hereby declares that this Resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.
- Section 6. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Resolution, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended.
- Section 7. This Resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so resolved.

BACKGROUND

The City of Schertz has received a petition for traffic extension for the gated community of Berry Creek. The Police Department patrols the gated communities; however, there are no agreements with the Berry Creek community to enforce traffic rules and laws related to the operation of motor vehicles on public roads.

Berry Creek is the second gated community to request traffic extension duties within the city. Berry Creek Homeowners Association Board unanimously voted (4-0) agreeing to the terms as stated in the petition.

The Texas Transportation Code (542.008) allows the following:

On a petition of 25 percent of the property owners residing in the subdivision or on the request of the governing body may extend by ordinance any traffic rules that apply to a road owned by the municipality, or by the county which the municipality is located, to the roads in the subdivision so that the roads of the subdivision are under the same traffic rules if the governing body of the municipality finds the ordinance in the interest of the municipality generally.

GOAL

The City of Schertz and Berry Creek (Homeowners Association) would enter into an agreement that would allow the Schertz Police Department to enforce traffic rules and laws for a safer community overall.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

The community benefit for the Berry Creek subdivision residents is to provide a safer atmosphere using traffic enforcement as an effective tool to increase public safety by reducing traffic crashes, changes in driver behavior and compliance.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approving this Resolution by the City Council of the City of Schertz, Texas authorizing an agreement with the Berry Creek Homeowners Association for the purpose of traffic rules and laws.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is an associated cost for the replacement and installation of the signs within the Berry Creek subdivison, totaling \$1,604.91.

WHEREAS, the Statute authorizes, on petition of twenty-five percent (25%) of the property owners residing in a subdivision, the governing body of the municipality to extend by ordinance any traffic rules that apply to a road owned by the municipality, or by the county in which the municipality is located, to the roads in the subdivision so that the roads of the subdivision are under the same traffic rules, if the governing body of the municipality finds the ordinance in the interest of the municipality generally; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Statute, at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the property owners residing in Berry Creek together with the governing body of the Association, have petitioned the City to enforce the traffic rules and laws related to the operation of motor vehicles on public thoroughfares of the City on the Private Streets and to obtain the patrol presence of the City Police Department for the health, safety, and welfare of the City's citizens residing in Berry Creek (the "Petition"), said Petition being attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS the Owners and the Association acknowledge and agree that enforcement of the requests set forth in the Petition are subject to the passage of an ordinance by the City Council of the City stating that the Private Streets are to be considered to be public streets for the purposes of the application and enforcement of specified traffic rules and is further subject to an agreement being executed between the City and the Association.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCHERTZ:

- 1. That the Petition is hereby accepted by the City Council.
- That the City Manager is hereby authorized to execute an agreement detailing the obligations of the Association regarding payment and liability for traffic enforcement.
- 3. That this resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and is so resolved.

PETITION FOR CITY OF SCHERTZ POLICE PATROL AND ENFORCEMENT IN GATED COMMUNITY OF BERRY CREEK

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS Berry Creek is a private gated community in the City of Schertz, Guadalupe County, Texas generally located at Berry Creek Drive and containing a total of One Hundred and Twenty (120) residences; and

WHEREAS Berry Creek Homeowners Association is the owner of the private streets in Berry Creek and is responsible for the maintenance thereof; and

WHEREAS the Owners (as hereinafter defined) and the Association acknowledge that Berry Creek is a subdivision within the City limits of the City and in accordance with the Texas Transportation Code Section 542.008, as amended, the Association seeks to cause the traffic rules and laws related to operation of motor vehicles on public thoroughfares of the City to apply to the Private Streets in Berry Creek; and

WHEREAS the Statute applies to a subdivision in which the roads are privately owned or maintained, and to a municipality with a population of three hundred (300) or more; and

WHEREAS, the Statute authorizes, on petition of twenty-five percent (25%) of the property owners residing in a subdivision, the governing body of the municipality to extend by ordinance any traffic rules that apply to a road owned by the municipality, or by the county in which the municipality is located, to the roads in the subdivision so that the roads of the subdivision are under the same traffic rules, if the governing body of the municipality finds the ordinance in the interest of the municipality generally; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Statute, at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the property owners residing in Berry Creek (collectively, the "Owners"), together with the governing body of the Association, desire to petition the City to enforce the traffic rules and laws related to the operation of motor vehicles on public thoroughfares of the City on the Private Streets and to obtain the patrol presence of the City Police Department for the health, safety, and welfare of the City's citizens residing in Berry Creek; and

WHEREAS the Owners and the Association acknowledge and agree that enforcement of the requests set forth in this Petition for City of Schertz Police Patrol and Enforcement in Gated Community of Berry Creek are subject to the passage of an ordinance by the City Council of the City stating that the

Private Streets are to be considered to be public streets for the purposes of the application and enforcement of specified traffic rules; and

WHEREAS, the Owners and the Association acknowledge that if the City Council chooses to act on this Petition, the Owners and the Association may be required to enter into an agreement in the form of the Traffic Enforcement Agreement (Berry Creek) set forth on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes (the "Agreement"), as such form may be amended following City Council's receipt and review of this Petition, with the City setting forth the terms and conditions upon which the traffic rules that apply in the City shall apply in Berry Creek, and in that event, said agreement shall be an exhibit to the Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, this Petition is submitted to comply with the Statute and to request that the City Council accept the Petition and find that it is in the best interest of the City to draft and approve an ordinance authorizing the City to apply the City's traffic rules and laws related to operation of motor vehicles on public thoroughfares of the City to the Private Streets.

PETITION

Pursuant to the Statute, the Owners and the Association petition the City as follows:

1. General Nature of Requested Service:

The Owners and the Association petition the City to direct the City's Police Department to provide law enforcement to Berry Creek for the purposes of patrol, enforcement of traffic control, and laws related to operation of motor vehicles, investigation of criminal activity, and deterrence of criminal activity in the violation of City and State laws within the jurisdiction of the City's Police Department for the health, safety, and welfare of the City citizens residing in Berry Creek.

- 2. Satisfaction of Conditions Precedent:
- (a) The Statute applies to a subdivision in which the roads are privately owned or maintained. The Private Streets are privately owned and maintained by the Association.
- (b) The Statute applies to a municipality with a population of three hundred (300) or more, and the City is a municipality with a population of more than three hundred (300).
- (c) The Statute requires this Petition be made by either at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the property owners residing in Berry C reek or the governing body of the entity that maintains the Private Streets. The Owners and the Association have jointly submitted this Petition. Each Owner executing this Agreement covenants that he/she is the legal fee simple owner (and not a renter)

of the property address listed by his/her name on the signature pages to this Agreement.

3. Municipality May Extend Services:

The Statute provides that the governing body of the municipality may extend by ordinance any traffic rules that apply to a road owned by the municipality, or by the county in which the municipality is located, to the roads in the subdivision so that the roads of the subdivision, such as Berry Creek, are under the same traffic rules, if the governing body of the municipality finds the ordinance in the interest of the municipality generally.

4. Traffic Rules Sought to Be Extended:

The Owners and the Association seek to extend all traffic rules of City thoroughfares similar to those within Berry Creek to the Private Streets, including, but not limited to:

- (a) Speed limit of 20 mph.
- (b) Vehicle registration and inspection laws; and
- (c) Traffic rules and laws regarding speed, signal indicators, stop signs, parking, and similar traffic laws.

In compliance with the Statute, this Petition specifies the traffic rules that are sought to be extended. The Owners and the Association request that the City extend all of such requested rules to the Private Streets for the safety, health, and welfare of the City's citizens residing in Berry Creek.

5. Traffic Enforcement Agreement:

The Owners and the Association desire to enter into the Agreement with the City.

6. Lack of Necessity for Payment of Costs of Police Service:

The Owners and the Association seek no different enforcement or service than that made available and provided to all other citizens and taxpayers of the City, and pursuant to the Statute. While the City may require that owners of property in the subdivision pay all or part of the cost of extending and enforcing the traffic rules in the subdivision, there should be no additional cost than that borne for any other citizen. Accordingly, the Association petitions that no additional charges be imposed for the provision of the police service in accordance with the agreement between the Association and the City.

7. Proposed Method of Enforcement:

If the City Council passes an Ordinance, the Owners and the Association acknowledge that the Private Streets will be considered to be public streets for purposes of the application and

enforcement of the specified traffic rules. The Owners and the Association will comply with all City requests for placement of necessary official traffic control devices on property abutting the Private Streets if those devices relate to a specified traffic rule and are either located on property owned by the Association or one of the Owners, the consent of the owner of that property (if not owned by the Association or one of the Owners) is obtained, or an easement is available for the placement of the device.

8. Execution:

This Petition is made and executed by the Owners and an authorized representative of the Association.

9. Submission of Petition:

This Petition will be filed with the City Secretary's office. The Owners and the Association submit this Petition and request that the City Council grant all matters requested herein and pass an appropriate ordinance of the City consistent with this Petition and the laws of the State of Texas and the City.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT AGREEMENT (Berry Creek)

This Traffic Enforcement Agreement (Berry Creek) (the "Agreement") among the City of Schertz, Texas, a Texas Municipal Corporation (the "City"), Berry Creek Home Owner's Association (the "Association"), and the undersigned parties, which parties represent at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the property owners residing in Berry Creek, as hereinafter defined (collectively, the "Owners"), is entered into as of the date of the final signature of the parties (the "Effective Date").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS Berry Creek ("Berry Creek") is a private gated community in the City of Schertz, Guadalupe County, Texas, generally located at Berry Creek Dr and containing a total of One Hundred Twenty (120) residences; and

WHEREAS the Association is the owner of the private streets in Berry Creek (the <u>"Private Streets"</u>) and is responsible for the maintenance thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Owners and the Association acknowledge that Berry Creek is a subdivision within the City limits of the City and in accordance with the Texas Transportation Code Section 542.008 (the "Statute"), the Owners and the Association presented a petition to the City Council of the City (the "City Council") seeking to cause the traffic rules and laws related to operation of motor vehicles on public thoroughfares of the City to apply to the Private Streets in Berry Creek (the "Petition"); and

WHEREAS, the City Council has found the Petition in the best interest of the City generally, has accepted the Petition, and directed the City staff to draft an ordinance and this Agreement, according to the requirements of the Statute to provide for the enforcement of the traffic rules and laws related to operation of motor vehicles on public thoroughfares of the City to apply to Private Streets in Berry Creek.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the City, the Association, and the Owners agree as follows:

- 1. Request Pursuant to the Statute. Pursuant to the Statute, the City agrees to extend the traffic rules and laws related to operation of motor vehicles on public thoroughfares of the City to apply to the Private Streets in Berry Creek. The Owners and the Association agree that, pursuant to this Agreement, the Private Streets are considered to be public streets for purposes of the application and enforcement of the traffic rules and laws addressed herein.
- 2. Traffic Signs. The Association shall install subdivision traffic signs and street name blade signs in compliance with both the Texas Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Device standards and the City's standards. The Association shall be solely responsible for all costs and expenses of the signs and the installation thereof.

- 3. **Speed Humps**. The Owners and the Association agree that all speed humps on the Private Streets must comply with the City's standards. New speed humps must receive approval through the normal City process and are the discretion of the City of Schertz based on City policies and standards. The Association shall be solely responsible for all costs and expenses necessary to bring and keep the speed humps in compliance.
- 4. **Plans, Installation, and Approval**. Prior to installation of the subdivision traffic signs and street name blade signs and prior to work being done on the speed humps, the Association shall submit plans for the design and specifications of such traffic and street name or other signage and such speed humps and obtain written approval from the City. The Association shall construct, repair, and/or install, or cause the construction, repair, and/or installation of, such signage and speed humps in accordance with the approved plans.
- 5. **Association Obligations**. The Association will pay for all repairs, replacement, and maintenance of all signage and speed humps to maintain compliance with the applicable standards set forth herein. All maintenance performed by the Association will meet the specifications of the codified requirements of the City related to traffic signage and speed humps in residential subdivisions. If the City determines that repairs, replacement, and/or maintenance are required, the City shall inform the Association in writing of the need for said repairs, replacement, and/or maintenance, and the Association shall commence said repairs, replacement, and/or maintenance within fourteen (14) calendar days of such notice and diligently pursue the work thereon, with completion thereof not to exceed forty-five (45) calendar days.
- 6. **The City's Obligations**. The City hereby agrees that it will extend and enforce (to the same extent it would enforce such rules and laws in other areas of the City) any traffic rules and laws related to the operation of motor vehicles on public thoroughfares in the City to the Private Streets.
- 7. **Traffic Control Devices**. Pursuant to the authority granted under the Statute, the City may place official traffic control devices on property abutting the Private Streets if (1) those devices relate to a specified traffic rule; and (2) the consent of the owner of that property is obtained or an easement is available for the placement. The Owners and the Association hereby consent to the placement of any such devices on the property owned by them. No additional consent shall be required.
- 8. **Payment**. The Owners and the Association will not be required to pay any additional cost for the services requested herein, unless such services are requested in excess of the services provided to City citizens that do not reside in private gated communities in the City. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Association shall be required to pay those costs and expenses discussed in Sections 2., 3., and 5. of this Agreement.
- 9. INDEMNIFICATION. THE ASSOCIATION AND EACH OF THE OWNERS, INDIVIDUALLY AND ON BEHALF OF EACH OF THEIR SUCCESSORS, ASSIGNEES, GRANTEES, AND/OR TRUSTEES DOES HEREBY AGREE TO RELEASE, DEFEND, INDEMNIFY, AND HOLD HARMLESS THE CITY AND ITS CITY COUNCILMEMBERS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, REPRESENTATIVES, AND EMPLOYEES (THE "INDEMNIFIED PARTIES") FROM AND AGAINST ALL

DAMAGES, INJURIES (INCLUDING DEATH), CLAIMS, PROPERTY DAMAGES (INCLUDING LOSS OF USE), LOSSES, DEMANDS, SUITS, JUDGMENTS AND COSTS, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, REASONABLE ATTORNEYS' FEES AND EXPENSES (INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, ATTORNEYS' FEES AND EXPENSES INCURRED IN ENFORCING THIS INDEMNITY), CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENT, GROSSLY NEGLIGENT, AND/OR INTENTIONAL ACT AND/OR OMISSION OF THE ASSOCIATION AND/OR EACH OF THE OWNERS IN THE PERFORMANCE OF ITS OBLIGATIONS UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, REGARDLESS OF THE JOINT OR CONCURRENT NEGLIGENCE OR STRICT LIABILITY OF THE CITY (HEREINAFTER "CLAIMS"). THE ASSOCIATION AND THE OWNERS ARE EXPRESSLY REQUIRED TO DEFEND THE INDEMNIFIED PARTIES AGAINSTALL SUCH CLAIMS.

IN ITS SOLE DISCRETION, THE CITY SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO APPROVE OR SELECT DEFENSE COUNSEL TO BE RETAINED BY THE ASSOCIATION AND/OR THE OWNERS IN FULFILLING THEIR OBLIGATIONS HEREUNDER TO DEFEND AND INDEMNIFY THE INDEMNIFIED PARTIES, UNLESS SUCH RIGHT IS EXPRESSLY WAIVED BY THE CITY IN WRITING. THE CITY RESERVES THE RIGHT TO PROVIDE A PORTION OR ALL OF ITS OWN DEFENSE; HOWEVER THE CITY IS UNDER NO OBLIGATION TO DO SO.

THIS SECTION 9. SHALL SURVIVE THE TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT WITH RESPECT TO ANY INCIDENT OCCURRING DURING THE TERM HEREOF.

11. Miscellaneous.

- (a) Breach. In the event of a breach of this Agreement by any party, any other party may pursue any remedies available at law or in equity, including without limitation, specific performance.
- (b) Assignment, Binding Nature, and Recording. This Agreement may not be assigned by the Association or the Owners.
- (c) Notices. Any notice required or permitted by this Agreement is effective when personally delivered in writing or two (2) business days after notice is deposited with the U.S. Postal Service, postage prepaid, certified mail with return receipt requested, and addressed as follows:

The parties may, from time to time, change their respective addresses listed above to any other location in the United States for the purpose of notice under this Agreement. A party's change of address shall be effective when notice of change is provided to the other party in accordance with the provisions of this Section 10. (c).

- (d) <u>Capacities.</u> The person executing this Agreement on behalf of the Association represents and warrants that he/she has the authority to do so in the capacity stated.
- (e) <u>Interpretation</u>. This Agreement will be deemed drafted equally by all parties hereto. The language of all parts of this Agreement will be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning, and any presumption or principle that the language in this Agreement is to be construed against any party will not apply. Headings in this Agreement are for the convenience of the parties and are not intended to be used in construing this document.
- (f) <u>Further Assurances</u>. The parties agree to take such further actions and to sign such further documents as may be reasonably necessary or appropriate to fulfill the intent of, and to complete the transactions described in this Agreement.

BACKGROUND

The City of Santa Clara is establishing a new Marshal public safety program. The city is in need of public safety equipment in order to protect and safeguard the public health and safety of its residents. In connection with mutual aid agreements and the close proximity of the City of Santa Clara, the City of Schertz would like to donate a decommissioned 2012 Chevrolet Police Tahoe. This donation will assist a neighboring city with its new public safety program.

GOAL

To dontate a decomissioned police vehicle (2012 Chevrolet Tahoe) for the use of public safety duties within the City of Santa Clara.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

The donation would allow the City of Santa Clara to provide quality public safety services to its residents by enforcing laws, preventing crimes, responding to emergencies, and providing support services.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

The City of Schertz and the City of Santa Clara would enter into a mutual agreement that would allow the City of Schertz to donate surplus property (2012 Chevrolet Tahoe) for the use of public safety within their city.

FISCAL IMPACT

There would be no fiscal impact as this donation was a decommissioned vehicle by the City of Schertz.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of Resolution No. 21-R-87.

DONATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS AND THE CITY OF SANTA CLARA, TEXAS

WHEREAS, the City of Schertz is a Home Rule municipality in the State of Texas, established pursuant to its City Charter and the Texas Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Clara is a neighboring city seeking to establish a police department; and

WHEREAS, the City of Schertz finds that the proposed donation of certain surplus personal property will provide a public benefit; and

WHEREAS, the City of Schertz desires to donate surplus personal property, specifically a police vehicle as described herein, to the City of Santa Clara; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement is to memorialize the understanding between the City of Schertz and the City of Santa Clara outline the parties rights and obligations relating to the donation;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements set forth herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1) **Donation**

- a. *The Donation*. The City of Schertz agrees to donate and transfer, and the City of Santa Clara agrees to accept, pursuant to the terms of this agreement, all title, right and interest in a 2012 Chevrolet Tahoe, VIN No. 1GNLC2E0XCR188641 with associated equipment (the "Property").
- b. *Representations*. The City of Schertz represents and warrants that it has the ownership interest in the Property being donated to the City of Santa Clara and that the representative of the City of Schertz is authorized to make the donation and enter into this agreement on behalf of the City of Santa Clara.
- 2) Use. The City of Santa Clara agrees to use the Property for public safety enforcement and protection purposes of the City of Santa Clara, and pursuant to any mutual aid agreements or needs which exist or may arise between the parties, for the lesser of the useful life of the Property or five years. After such time, the City of Santa Clara shall own the Property without limitation.
- 3) **Condition.** The City of Santa Clara accepts the Property "as is," and the City of Schertz makes no representations or warrants as to the condition or usefulness of the Property. The City of Schertz shall have no liability and the City of Santa Clara shall hold harmless the City of Schertz and its officials, employees, agents, and representatives from and against

any and all liability, actions, claims, demands, or damages arising out of the donation and use of the Property.

- 4) **Reversion.** If the City of Santa Clara does not use the Property for public safety protection purposes for the time period described in item (2), possession, title, and ownership of the Property shall revert to the City.
- 5) **Amendment**. This Agreement may be amended by written agreement of the parties. This Agreement is for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns and nothing herein, express or implied, is intended to or shall confer upon any other person or entity any legal or equitable right, benefit, or remedy of any nature whatsoever under or by reason of this Agreement.
- 6) **Immunities**. It is not the intent of either the City of Schertz or the City of Santa Clara that this Agreement waive any governmental immunities that they may enjoy pursuant to the Texas Constitution or the statutes of this state.

Resolution No. 21-R-109 — Consideration and/or action approving a Resolution by the City Council of the City of Schertz, Texas authorizing the City Manager to sign a contract for mutual aid for fire emergency services with the Secretary of the Air

Force, specifically for Joint Base San Antonio. (C. Kelm/K. Long)

BACKGROUND

The Schertz Fire Department is charged with the responsibility of regional fire suppression, protection and prevention. The Fire Department does not have the means to effectively remediate certain emergency situations without the assistance of outside agencies. Suburban Fire Departments typically enter into mutual aid agreements with each other for that purpose. During structure fires or other emergencies that exceed the capacity of a single fire department, surrounding fire departments mutually respond to assist the requesting department. Mutual aid agreements include clauses that protect the respective cities for committing resources outside their boundaries when such would be detrimental to those cities. The obligation to respond is always contingent upon the ability to maintain adequate protection at home.

JBSA employs a well-trained cadre of firefighters on base for aircraft emergencies as well as structural responses. Schertz Fire has enjoyed a mutually beneficial relationship with the military firefighters, training with them regularly. We have assisted them in the past with their air show emergency stand-by and response, and they have assisted us on fires in our city.

GOAL

City staff recommends Council approval of Resolution 21-R-109 to authorize the City Manager to sign the mutual aid agreement between the City of Schertz and Joint Base San Antonio for Fire Emergency Services.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

It is not feasible for fire departments to maintain the amount of staffing necessary to combat a typical house fire. Therefore, most suburban fire departments provide adequate manpower for the initial fire attack and rely on mutual aid partners for additional help when needed. Mutual aid is an efficient use of equipment and manpower when an emergency exceeds the capability of everyday staffing.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

City staff recommends Council approval of Resolution 21-R-109 to authorize the City Manager to sign the mutual aid agreement between the City of Schertz and Joint Base San Antonio for Fire Emergency Services.

There is no fiscal impact.

MUTUAL AID IN FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES Agreement Number: FB3089-21297-0012

This Mutual Aid Agreement (the "Agreement"), is made and entered into this 23rd day of October 2020, between the Secretary of the Air Force (the "Air Force") acting by and through the Joint Base Commander, Joint Base San Antonio - 502d Air Base Wing (JBSA - 502 ABW), pursuant to the authority of 42 U.S.C. § 1856a and the Fire Department of Schertz the "Schertz Department". Together the Air Force and the Schertz Department are hereinafter referred to as the "Parties".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, each of the Parties hereto maintains equipment and personnel for the suppression of fires and the management of other emergency incidents occurring within areas under their respective jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, as set forth in 42 U.S.C. § 1856 the term 'fire protection' includes personal services and equipment required for fire prevention, the protection of life and property from fire, firefighting, and emergency services, including basic medical support, basic and advanced life support, hazardous material containment and confinement, and special rescue incidents involving vehicular and water mishaps, and trench, building, and confined space extractions; and

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto desire to augment the fire protection capabilities available in their respective jurisdictions by entering into this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, obligations and agreements herein established, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

- a. The authority to enter into this Agreement is set forth in 42 U.S.C. § 1856a, and Title 15 United States Code Section 2210, the regulations implementing same at Title 44 Code of Federal Regulations Part 151 Emergency Management and Assistance and AFI 32-2001, Fire and Emergency Services Program.
- b. This Agreement will serve as the agreement between the Parties for securing to each mutual aid in fire protection services as defined above.
- c. On request to a representative of the JBSA 502 ABW fire department by a representative of the *Schertz Department*, fire protection equipment and personnel of the JBSA 502 ABW fire department will be dispatched to any point within the area for which the *Schertz Department* normally provides fire protection services as designated by the representatives of the *Schertz Department*.
- d. On request to a representative of the *Schertz Department* by a representative of the JBSA 502ABW fire department, fire protection equipment and personnel of the *Schertz Department* will be dispatched to any point within the jurisdiction of the JBSA 502 ABW as designated by the representative of the JBSA 502 ABW) fire department.
- e. Any dispatch of equipment and personnel by the Parties pursuant to this Agreement is subject to the following conditions:

- (1) Any request for aid hereunder will include a statement of the amount and type of equipment and personnel requested and will specify the location to which the equipment and personnel are to be dispatched, but the amount and type of equipment and the number of personnel to be furnished will be determined by the responding organization. The requesting organization will ensure access to site for the responding organization.
- (2) The responding organization will report to the officer in charge of the requesting organization at the location to which the equipment is dispatched, and will be subject to the orders of that official.
- (3) The responding organization will be released by the requesting organization when the services of the responding organization are no longer required or when the responding organization is needed within the area for which it normally provides fire protection.
- (4) HAZMAT incident response will include the response to, and control and containment of any release or suspected release of any material suspected to be or known to be hazardous. Where the properties of a released material are not known, it will be considered hazardous until proven otherwise by the requesting organization using all technical resources available. Cleanup and removal of contained HAZMAT will be the responsibility of the requesting organization.
- (5) In the event of a crash of an aircraft owned or operated by the United States or military aircraft of any foreign nation within the area for which the *Schertz Department* normally provides fire protection services, the chief of the JBSA 502 ABW fire department or his or her representative may assume full command on arrival at the scene of the crash.
- f. Each Party hereby agrees that its intent with respect to the rendering of assistance to the other Party under this Agreement is not to seek reimbursement from the Party requesting such assistance. Notwithstanding the above, the Parties hereby recognize that pursuant to the Section 11 of the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. § 2210) and Federal regulations issued there under (44 Code of Federal Regulations Part 151), Schertz Department is permitted to seek reimbursementfor all or any part of its direct expenses and losses (defined as additional firefighting costs over normal operational costs) incurred in fighting fires on property under the jurisdiction of the United States. Furthermore, under the authority of 42 U.S.C. § 1856a, and pursuant to any applicable state or local IAW each Party hereby reserves the right to seek reimbursement from the other for all or any part of the costs (defined as additional firefighting costs over normal operational costs) incurred by it in providing fire protection services to the other Party in response to a request for assistance. Furthermore, Schertz Department agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the United States from any liability that may arise from the use of fire-fighting foams, chemicals, or other materials by the Air Force in providing fire protection services to the Schertz Department, which agreement to indemnify and hold harmless includes, but is not limited to, such uses that may result in hazardous substance exposure or pollution of or contamination to air, land, water, person or property or such uses that may result in response actions under CERCLA, RCRA, or any other federal, state, or local laws. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, termination of this Agreement shall in no way affect Schertz Department's obligation under this paragraph to indemnify and hold harmless the United States from any liability that may arise from the use of fire-fighting foams, chemicals, or other materials by the Air Force in providing fire protection services to the Schertz Department, which obligation shall survive such termination.

- (6) Where local agencies do not assign an incident safety officer, an Air Force representative will be assigned to act as the incident safety officer for JBSA 502 ABW to observe Air Force operations.
- g. Both Parties agree to implement the National Incident Management System during all emergency responses on and off Installations IAW National Fire Protection Association Standard 1561.
- h. Each Party waives all claims against the other Party for compensation for any loss, damage, personal injury, or death occurring as a consequence of the performance of this Agreement. This provision does not waive any right of reimbursement pursuant to paragraph f.
- i. All equipment used by *Schertz Department* in carrying out this Agreement will, at the time of action hereunder, be owned by it; and all personnel acting for *Schertz Department* under this Agreement will, at the time of such action, be an employee or volunteer member of *Schertz Department*.
- j. The rendering of assistance under the terms of this Agreement will not be mandatory; however, the Party receiving a request for assistance will endeavor to immediately inform the requesting Party if the requested assistance cannot be provided and, if assistance can be provided, the quantity of such resources as may be dispatched in response to such request.
- k. Neither Party will hold the other Party liable or at fault for failing to respond to any request for assistance or for failing to respond to such a request in a timely manner or with less than optimum equipment and/or personnel, it being the understanding of the Parties that each is primarily and ultimately responsible for the provision of fire protection services needed within their own jurisdictions.
- I. Disputes. Parties to Negotiate. If a dispute should arise, the Parties agree to first attempt to resolve the dispute using unassisted negotiation techniques (i.e., without the assistance of a neutral third party). Either Party may request in writing that unassisted negotiations commence. As part of the unassisted negotiation, the Parties shall consider employing joint fact-finding, if material factual disputes are involved, and shall use other early resolution techniques appropriate to the circumstances. If the dispute involves material issues of fact, the Parties may employ a neutral third party to provide a confidential evaluation of the issues of fact.
- m. Alternative Dispute Resolution.
- 1. If the dispute is not resolved within sixty (60) days after the request for unassisted negotiations, and the Parties do not mutually agree to continue the unassisted negotiations, the Parties shall employ alternative dispute resolution procedures involving nonbinding mediation of the dispute by a neutral third party. The alternative dispute resolution procedures employed shall include a confidential evaluation of both the facts and the law and the issuance of confidential recommendations by the neutral third party.
- 2. By entering into this Agreement, the Parties have voluntarily adopted alternative dispute resolution procedures IAW 5 United States Code. § 572(c). These procedures shall not be employed if determined by either Party to be inappropriate after taking into consideration the factors enumerated at 5 United States Code. § 572(b). A Party rejecting alternative dispute resolution as inappropriate shall document its reasons in writing and deliver them to the other Party. The Parties shall enter into a master written alternative dispute resolution Agreement governing alternative dispute resolution proceedings that may

be amended as needed to fit individual proceedings. (A template of an acceptable alternative dispute resolution agreement may be found at www.adr.af.mil).

- 3. The Government's obligation to make any payment arising out of an agreement resolving a dispute under this Agreement is contingent upon the availability of funds proper for such payment. The *Schertz Department* obligation to make any payment arising out of an agreement resolving a dispute underthis Agreement is contingent upon the availability of funds proper for such payment.
- n. All notices, requests, demands, and other communications which may or are required to be delivered hereunder will be in writing and will be delivered by messenger, by a nationally-recognized overnight mail delivery service or by certified mail, return receipt requested, at the following addresses:

- q. The modification or amendment of this Agreement, or any of the provisions of this Agreement, will not become effective unless executed in writing by both Parties.
- r. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original.

Browne/B. James)

BACKGROUND

In May or 2020, the City Council approved resolution 20-R-52 that authorized the City to enter into an agreement with ILF N-T Owner, LP, the developer of the Homestead residential development. The agreement was a reimbursement agreement associated with the acquisition of the easements needed for a sewer force main. The developer is constructing a sewer lift station and associated force main. The lift station will serve the Homestead project and surrounding properties. The developer had been trying to acquire the necessary easements and sought the City's assistance. The City agreed to help acquire the easements to provide necessary sewer service to the area and the developer agreed to pay the cost associated with the acquisition.

Multiple easements are needed from two property owners. The developer has reached agreement to acquire the needed easements from one of the property owner.

The City has reached agreement with the other property owner for the 3 permanent easements and 3 temporary construction easements. Staff is seeking approval from City Council to purchase the needed easements. The developer will provide the funding to the City to acquire the easements.

GOAL

Acquire three permanent easements and three temporary construction easements from Nolley Lake Properties, LLC.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

The easements are necessary to provide for sewer service to an area of northern Schertz.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Approval of Resolution 21-R-53 authorizing the City to acquire the necessary easements.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the City as the developer of Homestead, ILF N-T Owner, LP will be reimbursing the City for the costs associated with acquiring the easements. The purchase price of the easements on the Nolley Lake Properties, LLC property is \$115,000.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval of Resolution 21-R-53.

RESOLUTION NO. 20-R-52

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH THE DEVELOPER OF THE HOMESTEAD SUBDIVISION PROJECT FOR THE REIMBURSMENT OF COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH EASEMENT ACQUISITION NECESSARY FOR PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS.

WHEREAS, there is a lack of sewer service to serve an area of northern Schertz near the intersection of IH-35 and Schwab road.

WHEREAS, the sewer forcemain improvements offsite sewer improvements are needed to provide adequate sewer service to these areas and there is limited space to provide this public infrastructure.

WHEREAS, the Developer of the Homestead Subdivision agrees to construct sewer infrastructure of which the capacity is more than is required by the Homestead property,

WHEREAS, there is a benefit to oversizing sewer infrastructure to serve other properties,

WHEREAS, the Developer of the Homestead Subdivision has acquired some of the easements necessary for construction of the sewer improvements, but has not been able acquire them all, and

WHEREAS, the Developer of the Homestead Subdivision has requested the City assist in acquiring the remaining easements,

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the City to enter into the Agreement with Developer for acquisition of the easement necessary for the construction of Public Improvement in order to provide the infrastructure to serve other properties outside the boundary of the proposed Homestead Subdivision plat.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS THAT:

- Section 1. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to execute the agreement with Developer for easement acquisition associate with construction of Public Improvement with ILF N-T Owner, LP for infrastructure that will serve properties outside of the Homestead Subdivision and to defer construction of public improvements, generally in the form attached, subject to changes approved by the City Manager and City Attorney.
- Section 2. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.
- Section 3. All resolutions or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

Section 5. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City Council hereby declares that this Resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

Section 6. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Resolution, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended.

Section 7. This Resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so resolved.

GRANT OF EASEMENT:

NOLLEY CARIBBEAN PROPERTIES, L.L.C., a Wyoming limited liability company, with offices located at 300 Arcadia Court Pittsburgh, PA 15237 ("Grantor"), for the sum of Ten and No/100 Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged and confessed, does hereby grant, sell and convey unto THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS, a Texas home-rule city, with offices located at 1400 Schertz Parkway, Schertz, Texas 78154 ("Grantee"), an easement and right-of-way ("Easement") upon and across the property of Grantor which is shown on the sketch in Exhibit "A" and more particularly described on Exhibit "B", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference ("Easement Property"),

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same perpetually to Grantee and its successors and assigns, together with the rights, and privileges and on the terms and conditions set forth below; and Grantor, subject to the Exceptions, to Warranty, does hereby covenant and agree to WARRANT AND FOREVER DEFEND title to the Easement herein granted, unto Grantee, its successors and assigns, against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, by, through or under Grantor, but not otherwise.

Terms and Conditions: The following terms and conditions apply to the Easement granted by this agreement:

- 1. *Definitions*. For the purposes of this grant of Easement certain terms shall have the meanings that follow:
 - (a) "Holder" shall mean Grantee and Grantee's heirs, successors and assigns who at any time own any interest in the conveyance is subject to the terms of this agreement.
 - (b) "Public Utility" shall mean sanitary sewer facilities.
- 2. Character of Easement. The Easement granted herein is "in gross," in that there is no "Benefitted Property." Nevertheless, the Easement rights herein granted shall pass to Grantee's successors and assigns, subject to all of the Terms hereof. The

- Easement rights of use granted herein are nonexclusive and irrevocable. The Easement is for the benefit of Holder.
- 3. Purpose and Scope of Easement. The Easement shall be used solely for one sanitary sewer pipeline, with the pipe measuring no more than 12 inches in diameter, and related necessary appurtenant facilities to the sanitary sewer pipeline, such pipeline to be buried to a minimum depth of 4 feet from the top of the pipeline to the surface of the ground, including placement, construction, installation, replacement, repair, maintenance, relocation, removal, and operation of one 12 inch sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenant facilities, to the sanitary sewer pipeline. Above-ground appurtenances are limited to air release valves for the sanitary sewer pipeline. The Easement shall also be used for the purpose of providing access for the operation, repair, maintenance, and replacement of the sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenant facilities. construction of the sanitary sewer pipeline, Holder shall grade the surface of the ground within the Easement Property and restore it to the condition in which it existed before construction of the sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenances, and if Holder replaces, repairs, maintains, relocates, or removes the sanitary sewer pipeline and/or related necessary appurtenances, Holder shall restore Grantee's Property to the condition in which it existed before such replacement, repair, maintenance, relocation, or removal. Holder shall have no right to fence or enclose the Easement Property. The Easement is granted subject to other existing easements of record at the time of this grant.
- 4. *Term.* Easement shall be in perpetuity unless relinquished or abandoned by ordinance or resolution by Grantee.
- 5. Reservation of Rights. Holder's right to use the Easement Property is nonexclusive, and Grantor and Grantor's heirs, successors, and assigns retain the right to use all or part of the Easement Property in conjunction with Holder under the following conditions: such use by Grantor and Grantor's heirs, successors, and assigns does not interfere with the use of the Easement Property by Holder for the Easement Purpose; and Grantor may not construct any building, vertical structure or obstruction on the Easement Property, but Grantor may construct streets, driveways, drive aisles and parking facilities, together with the necessary paving, on the Easement Property. Grantor retains the right to convey to others the right to use all or part of the Easement Property in conjunction with Holder, as long as such further conveyance is subject to the terms of this agreement. Written approval of Holder must be obtained prior to any use or improvement of Easement Property not permitted herein, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 6. Temporary Construction Easement. Holder has the right (the "Temporary Construction Easement") to use the surface of the 10-foot wide area adjacent to the Easement Property ("Temporary Construction Area"), to assist in the initial installation of the sanitary sewer pipeline, which Temporary Construction Easement shall expire on the 180th day after construction begins on the sanitary sewer pipeline on the property. Holder shall promptly restore the area of the

- Temporary Construction Area to its previous physical condition if changed by use of the rights granted by this Temporary Construction Easement.
- 7. Improvement and Maintenance of Easement Property. Subject to the provisions of Section 8, immediately below, improvement and maintenance of the Easement Property and the sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenant facilities will be at the sole expense of Holder. Holder has the right to eliminate any encroachments installed on the Easement Property in violation of the terms set forth in this instrument, but Holder agrees that Grantor shall have the right to construct streets, driveways and drive aisles, and parking facilities, together with the necessary parking, on the Easement Property. Holder has the right to construct, install, maintain, replace, and remove the sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenant facilities under or across any portion of the Easement Property. Above-ground appurtenances are limited to air release valves for the sanitary sewer pipeline. All matters concerning the sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenant facilities and their configuration, construction, installation, maintenance, replacement, and removal are at Holder's sole discretion, subject to performance of Holder's obligations under this agreement. Holder has the right to remove or relocate any fences or other encroachments within the Easement Property or along its boundary lines if reasonably necessary to construct, install, maintain, replace, or remove the Facilities. Holder will also replace to their original condition any landscaping, driveways or parking areas that were in existence prior to the granting of the Easement Property and are damaged in connection with the work.
- 8. Maintenance of Surface Easement Property/Permitted Improvements. Notwithstanding any contrary provision, Grantor shall retain the obligation to maintain the surface of the Easement Property, including the obligation to regularly mow or cut back vegetation and to keep the surface of the Easement Property free of litter, debris, or trash. Any permitted improvement made by Grantor within the Easement Property must comply with applicable ordinances, development codes and engineering guidelines of the City of Schertz, and must not conflict with use of the Easement for its intended purpose as described herein.
- 9. Equitable Rights of Enforcement. This Easement may be enforced by restraining orders and injunctions (temporary or permanent) prohibiting interference and commanding compliance. Restraining orders and injunctions will be obtainable on proof of the existence of interference or threatened interference, with the necessity of proof of inadequacy of legal remedies or irreparable harm, and will be obtainable only by the parties to or those benefited by this agreement; provided, however, that the act of obtaining an injunction or restraining order will not be deemed to be an election of remedies or a waiver of any other rights or remedies available at law or in equity.
- 10. Attorney's Fees. If either party retains an attorney to enforce this agreement, the party prevailing in litigation is entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees and court and other costs.

- 11. Binding Effect. This agreement binds and inures to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, successors, and permitted assigns.
- 12. Choice of Law. This agreement will be construed under the laws of the state of Texas, without regard to choice-of-law rules of any jurisdiction. Venue is in the county or counties in which the Easement Property is located.
- 13. Counterparts. This agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts with the same effect as if all signatory parties had signed the same document. All counterparts will be construed together and will constitute one and the same instrument.
- 14. Waiver of Default. It is not a waiver of or consent to default if the non-defaulting party fails to declare immediately default or delays in taking any action. Pursuit of any remedies set forth in this agreement does not preclude pursuit of other remedies in this agreement or provided by law.
- 15. Further Assurances. Each signatory party agrees to execute and deliver any additional documents and instruments and to perform any additional acts necessary or appropriate to perform the terms, provisions, and conditions of this agreement and all transactions contemplated by this agreement.
- 16. *Integration*. This agreement contains the complete agreement of the parties and cannot be varied except by written agreement of the parties. The parties agree that there are no oral agreements, representations, or warranties that are not expressly set forth in this agreement.
- 17. Exceptions to Warranty. This grant is subject to any and all encumbrances and easements of record, to the extent the same are valid and enforceable.
- 18. Legal Construction. Any provision in this agreement is for any reason unenforceable, to the extent the unenforceability does not destroy the basis of the bargain among the parties, the unenforceability will not affect any other provision hereof, and this agreement will be construed as if the unenforceable provision had never been a part of the agreement. Whenever context requires, the singular will include the plural and neuter include the masculine or feminine gender, and vice versa. Article and section headings in this agreement are for reference only and are not intended to restrict or define the text of any section. This agreement will not be construed more or less favorably between the parties by reason of authorship or origin of language.
- 19. Notices. Any notice required or permitted under this agreement must be in writing. Any notice required by this agreement will be deemed to be delivered (whether actually received or not) when deposited with the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to the intended recipient at the address shown in this agreement. Notice may also be given

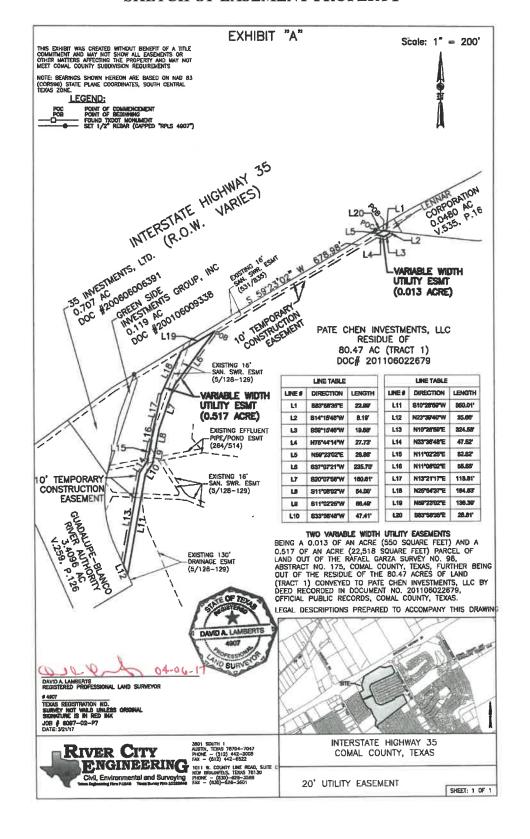

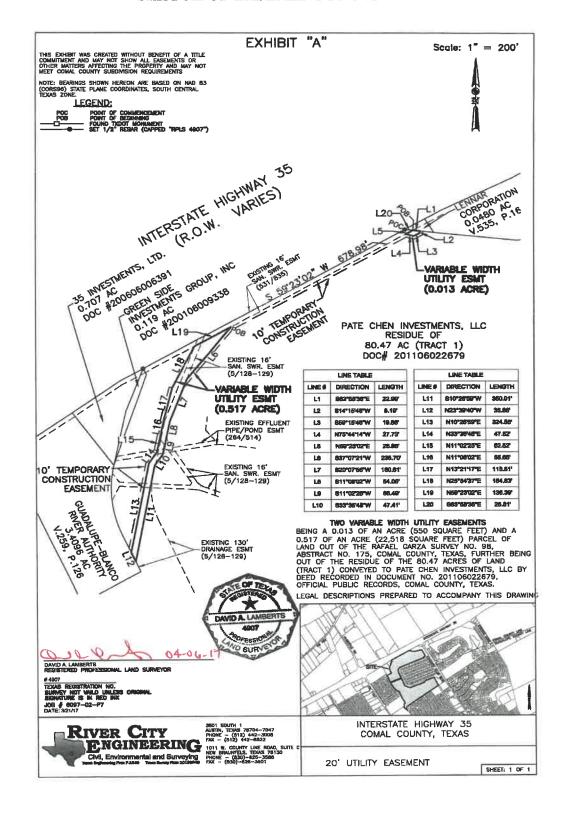

The Easement shall be used solely for one 3. sanitary sewer pipeline, with the pipe measuring no more than 12 inches in diameter, and related necessary appurtenant facilities to the sanitary sewer pipeline, such pipeline to be buried to a minimum depth of 4 feet from the top of the pipeline to the surface of the ground, including placement, construction, installation, replacement, repair, maintenance, relocation, removal, and operation of one 12 inch sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenant facilities, to the sanitary sewer pipeline. Above-ground appurtenances are limited to air release valves for the sanitary sewer pipeline. The Easement shall also be used for the purpose of providing access for the operation, repair, maintenance, and replacement of the sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenant facilities. construction of the sanitary sewer pipeline, Holder shall grade the surface of the ground within the Easement Property and restore it to the condition in which it existed before construction of the sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenances, and if Holder replaces, repairs, maintains, relocates, or removes the sanitary sewer pipeline and/or related necessary appurtenances, Holder shall restore Grantee's Property to the condition in which it existed before such replacement, repair, maintenance, relocation, or removal. Holder shall have no right to fence or enclose the Easement Property. The Easement is granted subject to other existing easements of record at the time of this grant.
- 4. *Term.* Easement shall be in perpetuity unless relinquished or abandoned by ordinance or resolution by Grantee.
- 5. Reservation of Rights. Holder's right to use the Easement Property is nonexclusive, and Grantor and Grantor's heirs, successors, and assigns retain the right to use all or part of the Easement Property in conjunction with Holder under the following conditions: such use by Grantor and Grantor's heirs, successors, and assigns does not interfere with the use of the Easement Property by Holder for the Easement Purpose; and Grantor may not construct any building, vertical structure or obstruction on the Easement Property, but Grantor may construct streets, driveways, drive aisles and parking facilities, together with the necessary paving, on the Easement Property. Grantor retains the right to convey to others the right to use all or part of the Easement Property in conjunction with Holder, as long as such further conveyance is subject to the terms of this agreement. Written approval of Holder must be obtained prior to any use or improvement of Easement Property not permitted herein, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 6. Temporary Construction Easement. Holder has the right (the "Temporary Construction Easement") to use the surface of the 10-foot wide area adjacent to the Easement Property ("Temporary Construction Area"), to assist in the initial installation of the sanitary sewer pipeline, which Temporary Construction Easement shall expire on the 180th day after construction begins on the sanitary sewer pipeline on the property. Holder shall promptly restore the area of the

- Temporary Construction Area to its previous physical condition if changed by use of the rights granted by this Temporary Construction Easement.
- 7. Improvement and Maintenance of Easement Property. Subject to the provisions of Section 8, immediately below, improvement and maintenance of the Easement Property and the sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenant facilities will be at the sole expense of Holder. Holder has the right to eliminate any encroachments installed on the Easement Property in violation of the terms set forth in this instrument, but Holder agrees that Grantor shall have the right to construct streets, driveways and drive aisles, and parking facilities, together with the necessary parking, on the Easement Property. Holder has the right to construct, install, maintain, replace, and remove the sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenant facilities under or across any portion of the Easement Property. Above-ground appurtenances are limited to air release valves for the sanitary sewer pipeline. All matters concerning the sanitary sewer pipeline and related necessary appurtenant facilities and their configuration, construction, installation, maintenance, replacement, and removal are at Holder's sole discretion, subject to performance of Holder's obligations under this agreement. Holder has the right to remove or relocate any fences or other encroachments within the Easement Property or along its boundary lines if reasonably necessary to construct, install, maintain, replace, or remove the Facilities. Holder will also replace to their original condition any landscaping, driveways or parking areas that were in existence prior to the granting of the Easement Property and are damaged in connection with the work.
- 8. Maintenance of Surface Easement Property/Permitted Improvements. Notwithstanding any contrary provision, Grantor shall retain the obligation to maintain the surface of the Easement Property, including the obligation to regularly mow or cut back vegetation and to keep the surface of the Easement Property free of litter, debris, or trash. Any permitted improvement made by Grantor within the Easement Property must comply with applicable ordinances, development codes and engineering guidelines of the City of Schertz, and must not conflict with use of the Easement for its intended purpose as described herein.
- 9. Equitable Rights of Enforcement. This Easement may be enforced by restraining orders and injunctions (temporary or permanent) prohibiting interference and commanding compliance. Restraining orders and injunctions will be obtainable on proof of the existence of interference or threatened interference, with the necessity of proof of inadequacy of legal remedies or irreparable harm, and will be obtainable only by the parties to or those benefited by this agreement; provided, however, that the act of obtaining an injunction or restraining order will not be deemed to be an election of remedies or a waiver of any other rights or remedies available at law or in equity.
- 10. Attorney's Fees. If either party retains an attorney to enforce this agreement, the party prevailing in litigation is entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees and court and other costs.

- 11. *Binding Effect.* This agreement binds and inures to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, successors, and permitted assigns.
- 12. Choice of Law. This agreement will be construed under the laws of the state of Texas, without regard to choice-of-law rules of any jurisdiction. Venue is in the county or counties in which the Easement Property is located.
- 13. Counterparts. This agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts with the same effect as if all signatory parties had signed the same document. All counterparts will be construed together and will constitute one and the same instrument.
- 14. Waiver of Default. It is not a waiver of or consent to default if the non-defaulting party fails to declare immediately default or delays in taking any action. Pursuit of any remedies set forth in this agreement does not preclude pursuit of other remedies in this agreement or provided by law.
- 15. Further Assurances. Each signatory party agrees to execute and deliver any additional documents and instruments and to perform any additional acts necessary or appropriate to perform the terms, provisions, and conditions of this agreement and all transactions contemplated by this agreement.
- 16. *Integration*. This agreement contains the complete agreement of the parties and cannot be varied except by written agreement of the parties. The parties agree that there are no oral agreements, representations, or warranties that are not expressly set forth in this agreement.
- 17. Exceptions to Warranty. This grant is subject to any and all encumbrances and easements of record, to the extent the same are valid and enforceable.
- 18. Legal Construction. Any provision in this agreement is for any reason unenforceable, to the extent the unenforceability does not destroy the basis of the bargain among the parties, the unenforceability will not affect any other provision hereof, and this agreement will be construed as if the unenforceable provision had never been a part of the agreement. Whenever context requires, the singular will include the plural and neuter include the masculine or feminine gender, and vice versa. Article and section headings in this agreement are for reference only and are not intended to restrict or define the text of any section. This agreement will not be construed more or less favorably between the parties by reason of authorship or origin of language.
- 19. Notices. Any notice required or permitted under this agreement must be in writing. Any notice required by this agreement will be deemed to be delivered (whether actually received or not) when deposited with the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, and addressed to the intended recipient at the address shown in this agreement. Notice may also be given

- by regular mail, personal delivery, courier delivery, facsimile transmission, or other commercially reasonable means and will be effective when actually received. Any address for notice may be changed by written notice delivered as provided herein.
- 20. Recitals/Exhibits. Any recitals in this agreement are represented by the parties to be accurate, and constitute a part of the substantive agreement. All exhibits referenced herein are attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein for all purposes.
- 21. Entire Agreement. This instrument contains the entire agreement between the parties relating to the rights herein granted and the obligations herein assumed. Any oral representation or modification concerning this instrument shall be of no force and effect except for any subsequent modification in writing, signed by the party to be charged.

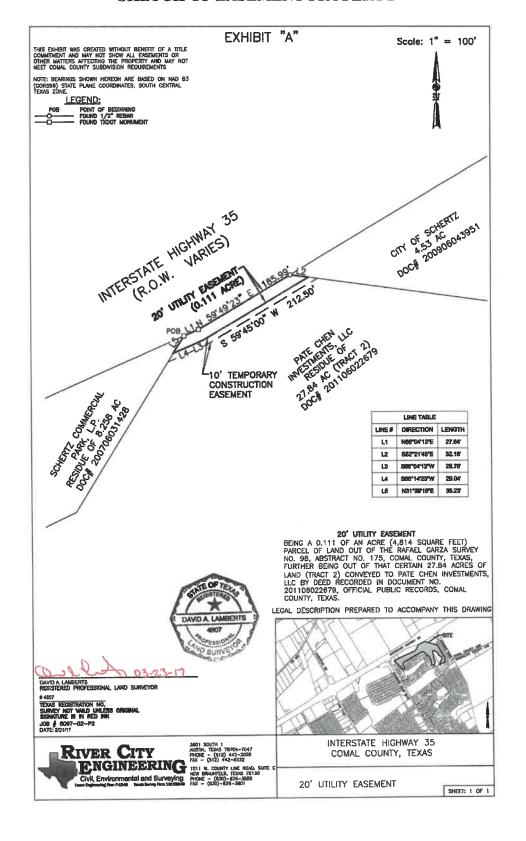

Ordinance No. 21-T-41 - Consideration and/or action approving an Ordinance by the City Council of the City of Schertz, Texas authorizing an adjustment to the FY 2020-21 Budget, and other matters in connection therewith. *Final Reading* (M.

Browne, B. James, J. Walters)

BACKGROUND

The City Budget for FY 2020-21 was approved by Ordinance 20-T-31. The budget can be modified by council authorization when necessary throughout the year.

As staff reviewed accounts coming to close at the end of the year, it became apparent some accounts would be over budget without further action. Many of those accounts will be covered by contingency authorized by the City Manager but some funds will need Council authorizations to authorize a transfer of budget between departments and an increase in the General Fund from sales taxes.

Staff proposes to increase the Fire Department's personnel lines by \$466,375 and cover the increase with \$40,000 from Planning & Zoning personnel and \$80,000 from Streets personnel, savings due to turnover and extended vacancies, to the Fire personnel lines and an increase in sales taxes of \$346,375.

Fire department's personnel increase was due to the pay structure changes in February 2021. EMS and Police also saw increases but were able to cover their increase with vacancy savings, operational savings, and use of contingnecy.

Staff also proposes to transfer the water meter purchase budget from the Water & Sewer Admin over to Utility Billing as Utility Billing has take over ordering the meters and were already responsible for managin the installs. This transfer will be \$125,000 of the existing budget for this purpose and will not change the overall budget in the Water & Sewer Fund.

UPDATE: Included in the second reading is an adjustment to provide funding for the Women Hollering Trunk Line project. This adjustment will transfer \$7,795,000 from Sewer Capital Recovery reserves to the project. This will leave \$125,000 remaining in the Sewer Impact Fee Fund for misc expenditures as needed.

GOAL

To approve the budget adjustment for projected overbudget accounts.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

To maintain a complete and balanced budget.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends approval of Ordinance 21-T-41.

FISCAL IMPACT

This adjustment will recognize additional sales tax revenue of \$346,375 and allocate that to the Fire Department's personnel lines. All other adjustments are transfers between departments and do not change the overall approved budgets.

This adjustment will transfer \$7,795,000 from the Sewer Capital Recovery Fund to the Woman Hollering Trunk Line project. After the transfer, \$108,000 will remain in the fund for any misc expenditures related to the impact fees.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of Ordinance 21-T-41.

ORDINANCE NO. 21-T-41

AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS AUTHORIZING AN ADJUSTMENT TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2020-2021 BUDGET, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 20-T-31, the City of Schertz (the "<u>City</u>") adopted the budget for the City for the fiscal year 2020-2021 (the "<u>Budget</u>), which provides funding for the City's operations throughout the 2020-2021 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City needs to increase the budget by \$346,375 for Fire Department Personnel Costs; and

WHEREAS, the City needs to transfer \$40,000 from Planning & Zoning and \$80,000 from Streets to Fire Personnel Costs; and

WHEREAS, the City needs to transfer \$125,000 from Water & Sewer Administration to Utility Billing for water meter purchases; and

WHEREAS, the City needs to increase the budget by \$7,795,000 for the Woman Hollering Trunk Line project; and

WHEREAS, City staff recommends that the City Council of the City adjust the Budget and approve the ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to adjust the Budget and approve the increase in Fire Department Personnel and to transfer the budget related to water meter purchases from Water & Sewer Administration to Utility Billing, as more fully set forth in this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS:

- Section 1. The City shall increase Fire Department's Personnel Budget by \$466,375 for personnel costs related to the pay structure change.
- Section 2. The City shall decrease Planning & Zoning Personnel Budget by \$40,000 and Streets Personnel Budgets by \$80,000 to reallocate savings due to position vacancies.
 - Section 3. The City shall recognize an additional \$346,375 in Sales Tax revenues.
- Section 4. The City shall transfer \$125,000 from Water & Sewer Administration to Utility Billing for the purchase of water meters.

Section 5. The City shall increase the project budget of the Woman Hollering Trunk Line project by \$7,795,000 funded by a transfer from reserves in the Sewer Capital Impact Fee Fund.

Section 6. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Ordinance for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the Council.

Section 7. All ordinances and codes, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

Section 9. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City hereby declares that this Ordinance would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

Section 10. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Ordinance is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Ordinance, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, as amended, Texas Government Code.

Section 11. This Ordinance shall be effective upon the date of final adoption hereof and any publication required by law.

BACKGROUND

Section 1201.042 of the Texas Government Code allows for the city to reimburse itself for expenses made before debt is issued. This is most helpful when the intent of issuing debt is already established but the project needs to be started before the bonds are issued. This delay could be due to timing constraints or to consolidate debt to reduce issuing costs.

This resolution is related to the Woman Hollering Sewer Trunk Line project. Staff had been aware that there were not enough sewer impact fees available to complete the project. As this is an eligible impact fee project, any debt issued can be repaid from future impact fee collections. This way it would not affect current utility rates or impede other maintenance projects.

This resolution will allow the City to reimburse itself from bonds issued in July/August of 2022. This would be combined into any other bond issues to reduce costs related to the sale of bonds.

This resolution does not obligate the City to issue bonds for this project. Council can decide not to issue debt for this project if other funding sources become available.

GOAL

Ensure adequate funding is available for the Woman Hollering Trunk Line Project.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

This line would provide sewer service for a large area in southern Schertz.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends adopting this resolution in order to reimburse the city with the sale of bonds.

FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated total construction cost is \$11,583,000. The project will be funded from the remainder of the 2013 Bonds for this project, \$7,795,000 million from Sewer Capital Recovery, and \$2,200,000 from the sale of debt.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of resolution 21-R-111 with the motion

A RESOLUTION RELATING TO ESTABLISHING THE CITY'S INTENTION TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FOR THE PRIOR LAWFUL EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS RELATING TO CONSTRUCTING VARIOUS CITY IMPROVEMENTS FROM THE PROCEEDS OF TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS TO BE ISSUED BY THE CITY FOR AUTHORIZED PURPOSES; AUTHORIZING OTHER MATTERS INCIDENT AND RELATED THERETO; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City Council (the *Governing Body*) of the City of Schertz, Texas (the *Issuer*) has entered into or will enter into various contracts pertaining to the expenditure of lawfully available funds of the Issuer to finance the costs associated with (i) designing, constructing, acquiring, purchasing, renovating, equipping, enlarging, and improving the City's utility system (and any necessary or related removal of existing facilities), and the purchase of materials, supplies, equipment, machinery, land, and rights-of-way for authorized needs and purposes relating to the aforementioned improvements (the *Construction Costs*), (ii) the payment of various engineering costs, including design testing, design engineering, and construction inspection related to the Construction Costs (the *Engineering Costs*), (iii) the payment of various architectural costs, including preparation of plans and specifications and various other plans and drawings related to the Construction Costs (the *Architectural Costs*), and (iv) the payment of various administrative costs, including the fees of bond counsel, financial advisor, project manager, project consultant, other professionals, and bond printer (the *Administrative Costs*) [the Construction Costs, the Engineering Costs, the Architectural Costs, and the Administrative Costs collectively constitute the costs of the Issuer's projects that are the subject of this Resolution (the *Project*)]; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of Section 1201.042, as amended, Texas Government Code (Section 1201.042) provide that the proceeds from the sale of obligations issued to finance the acquisition, construction, equipping, or furnishing of any project or facilities, such as the Project, may be used to reimburse the Issuer for costs attributable to such project or facilities paid or incurred before the date of issuance of such obligations; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Treasury (the *Department*) released Regulation Section 1.150-2 (the *Regulations*) which establishes when the proceeds of obligations are spent and therefore are no longer subject to various federal income tax restrictions contained in the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the *Code*); and

WHEREAS, the Issuer intends to reimburse itself, within eighteen months from the later of the date of expenditure or the date the property financed is placed in service (but in no event more than three years after the original expenditures are paid), for the prior lawful capital expenditure of funds from the proceeds of one or more series of tax-exempt obligations (the *Obligations*) that the Issuer currently contemplates issuing in the principal amount of not to exceed \$2,200,000 to finance a portion of the costs of the Project; and

WHEREAS, under the Regulations, to fund such reimbursement with proceeds of the Obligations, the Issuer must declare its expectation ultimately to make such reimbursement before making the expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer hereby finds and determines that the reimbursement for the prior expenditure of funds of the Issuer is not inconsistent with the Issuer's budgetary and financial circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby finds and determines that the adoption of this Resolution is in the best interests of the residents of the Issuer; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCHERTZ, TEXAS THAT:

- SECTION 1. This Resolution is a declaration of intent to establish the Issuer's reasonable, official intent under section 1.150-2 of the Regulations and Section 1201.042 to reimburse itself from certain of the proceeds of the Obligations for any capital expenditures previously incurred (not more than 60 days prior to the date hereof) or to be incurred with respect to the Project from the Issuer's General Fund or other lawfully available funds of the Issuer.
- SECTION 2. The Issuer intends to issue the Obligations and allocate within 30 days after the date of issuance of the Obligations the proceeds therefrom to reimburse the Issuer for prior lawful expenditures with respect to the Project in a manner to comply with the Regulations.
- SECTION 3. The reimbursed expenditure will be a type properly chargeable to a capital account (or would be so chargeable with a proper election) under general federal income tax principles.
- SECTION 4. The Issuer intends to otherwise comply, in addition to those matters addressed within this Resolution, with all the requirements contained in the Regulations.
- SECTION 5. This Resolution may be relied upon by the appropriate officials at the Office of the Attorney General for the State of Texas and establishes compliance by the Issuer with the requirements of Texas law and the Regulations.
- SECTION 6. With respect to the proceeds of the Obligations allocated to reimburse the Issuer for prior expenditures, the Issuer shall not employ an abusive device under Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-10, including using within one year of the reimbursement allocation, the funds corresponding to the proceeds of the Obligations in a manner that results in the creation of "replacement proceeds", as defined in Treasury Regulation Section 1.148-1, of the Obligations or another issue of tax-exempt obligations.
- SECTION 7. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the Governing Body.
- SECTION 8. All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

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SECTION 9. This Resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

SECTION 10. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the Governing Body hereby declares that this Resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

SECTION 11. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Resolution, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, as amended, Texas Government Code.

SECTION 12. This Resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so resolved.

Resolution No. 21-R-106 — Consideration and/or action approving a Resolution by the City Council of the City of Schertz, Texas, authorizing a contract with Thalle Construction Co., Inc., relating to construction of the Woman Hollering Creek Wastewater Project and other matters in connection therewith. (B. James/K.

Woodlee)

BACKGROUND

The Woman Hollering Creek Wastewater Trunk Main and Lift Station Project (WHC WW Project) is part of the City's effort to establish and expand public wastewater collection and conveyance service to the southern portion of Schertz. The project generally consists of 13,000 linear feet (lf) of 30-inch diameter gravity main, 1,500 lf of 18-inch gravity main, 6,000 lf of 14-inch force main, and a wastewater lift station with 16-foot diameter storage and wet wells. The wastewater main will be installed within easements acquired from 20 separate property owners. Once constructed, the project will provide the backbone to a future system that will serve approximately 4,461 acres and 6,450 dwelling units in an area known as the WHC sewershed. The project will convey wastewater to the newly constructed CCMA water reclamation plant on Trainer Hale Road.

Proposals for the WHC WW Project were opened on July 28, 2021. Six responses were received and evaluated based on qualifications of bidder and experience on similar and public projects, available resources to complete the project, corporate history and stability, references, and cost. An evaluation team reviewed the bids and supporting documentation. Of the six proposals, the best qualified and lowest cost bid was from Thalle construction Co., Inc. Staff has determined that the offer from Thalle Construction Co., Inc., is acceptable.

In addition to bidding the project with standard materials historically used in the City of Schertz, and to the capacity required today, three alternatives were bid:

- 1. The first was for the use of fiberglass reinforced plastic (FRP) pipe in lieu of polyvinyl chloride (PVC) pipe. The use of FRP pipe was considered because of its expected cost competitiveness at the size required. Acceptance of this alternate results in a deduction from the base bid of \$190,075 and it is recommended by Staff.
- 2. The second alternative bid was for the use of polymer concrete manholes instead of more commonly used precast or cast in place concrete manholes. The benefits of the use of polymer concrete manholes include corrosion resistant characteristics, high structural strength with a thinner wall, and the fact that they are manufactured in taller sections than standard concrete manholes, thus minimizing the number of joints through which groundwater infiltration commonly occurs. The cost of the alternative using the polymer concrete manholes is an addition of \$433,970 to the base bid. Because of the positive attributes of the use of polymer manholes, and because the lowest cost bid came in lower than the budget considered, staff recommends acceptance of this alternate and installation of the polymer manholes.
- 3. The design of the lift station and forcemain was done in a manner that would operate under existing flow conditions and provide for ease of expansion to accommodate future flow with the

addition of another pump and a parallel second forcemain. The third alternate bid was for the installation of that second forcemain at this time. By doing that, future savings would be realized since additional mobilization and inflation costs would be eliminated. The cost impact of this alternate would be an additional \$2,053,130 on this contract and is cost prohibitive at this time. Staff recommends rejection of this bid alternate.

GOAL

The goal of this resolution is for City Council to authorize the execution of a construction contract for the Woman Hollering Creek Wastewater Project with Thalle Construction Co., Inc., including the acceptance of the Base Bid as well as Alternate 1 and Alternate 2, and rejection Alternate 3 for a total agreement amount of \$10,567,170. Approval of Resolution 21-R-106 will also authorize a contingency of expenditures with Thalle not to exceed \$11,100,100.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

Construction of the Woman Hollering Creek Wastewater Project in southern Schertz will provide wastewater conveyance capacity for existing and new development in the Woman Hollering Creek sewershed. This project will provide the initial flow of wastewater to the CCMA southern water reclamation plant that is complete, but unused to this time. Without this project, further development in this part of Schertz will be curtailed and limited to projects for which wastewater is collected and transported by truck (pumped and hauled) or treated via on site sewage facilities (OSSFs). The Woman Hollering Creek Wastewater system will provide for the conveyance of flows from the Hallie's Cove Subdivision (currently served by a pump and haul scenario). The project will also allow for elimination of the existing Sedona lift station on FM 1518 and the package wastewater treatment plant that currently treats wastewater generated by the Crossvine Subdivision and is quickly nearing maximum capacity.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is recommended that Council approve Resolution 21-R-106 to authorize execution of the construction contract for the Woman Hollering Creek Wastewater Project with Thalle Construction Co., Inc. for \$10,567,170 and a not to exceed amount of \$11,100,000.

FISCAL IMPACT

The not to exceed amount being authorized with Resolution 21-R-106 is \$11,100,000. Total funding needed for the current construction effort, including this construction contract together with ancillary tasks such as construction management and quality assurance services, field quality control and laboratory testing services, and extension of electric power to the lift station site is \$11,783,000. That funding is budgeted to come from 2013 Bond Sales (\$1,788,000), Wastewater Capital Recovery Funds (\$7,795,000), and planned Future Bond Sales (\$2,200,000).

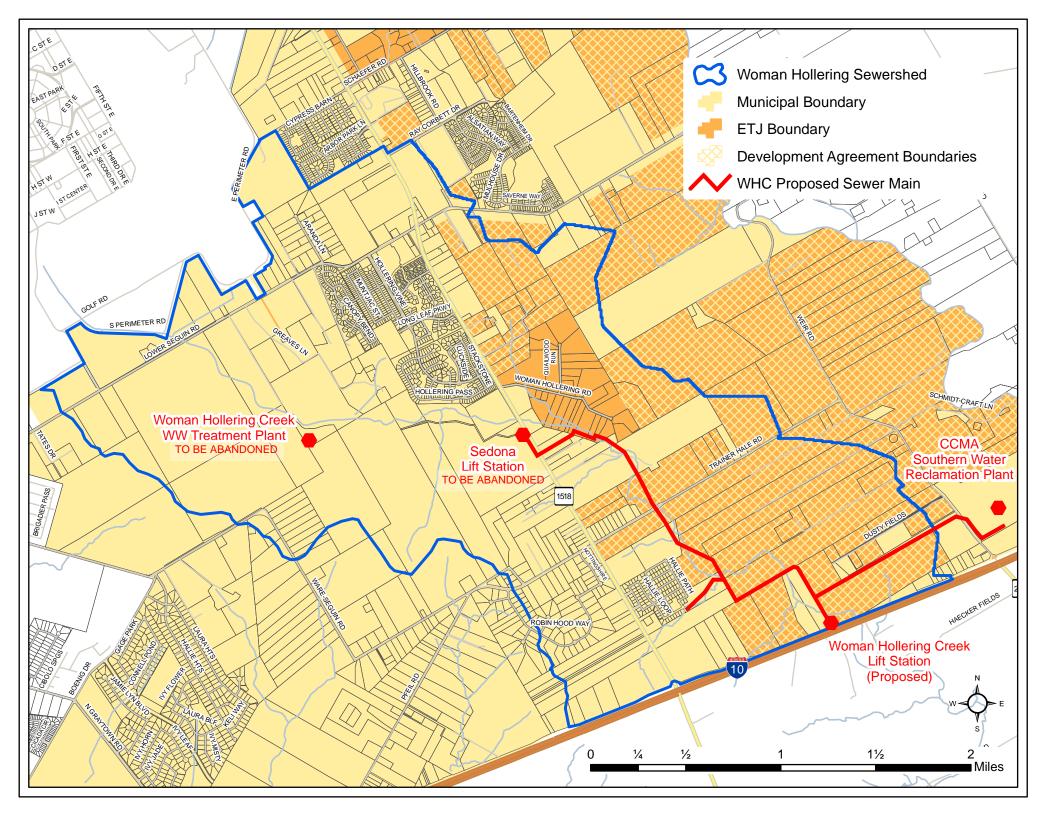
RECOMMENDATION

Owner and Contractor hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 – WORK

1.01 Contractor shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows:

ARTICLE 2 – THE PROJECT

2.01 The Project, of which the Work under the Contract Documents is a part, is generally described as follows: 2018 Street Preservation and Maintenance Project

ARTICLE 3 - ENGINEER

- 3.01 The part of the Project that pertains to the Work has been designed by <u>Cobb, Fendley & Associates</u>, Inc.
- 3.02 The Owner has retained AG/CM, Inc., ("Engineer") to act as Owner's representative, assume all duties and responsibilities, and have the rights and authority assigned to Engineer in the Contract Documents in connection with the completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 4 – CONTRACT TIMES

4.01 Time of the Essence

- A. All time limits for Milestones, if any, Substantial Completion, and completion and readiness for final payment as stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence of the Contract. Contract Times: Days
- B. The Work is expected to be substantially completed within the time agreed to during contract negotiation (anticipated duration 365 calendar days) calendar days after the date when the Contract Times commence to run as provided in Paragraph 4.01 of the General Conditions, and completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions within 30 calendar days after the date of substantial completion. The number of days to substantial completion will be negotiated with the successful bidder and shall be within the range listed in this paragraph.

4.02 Liquidated Damages

A. Contractor and Owner recognize that time is of the essence as stated in Paragraph 4.01 above and that Owner will suffer financial and other losses if the Work is not completed and Milestones not achieved within the times specified in Paragraph 4.02 above, plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with the Contract. The Contractor acknowledges and recognizes that the Owner is entitled to full and beneficial occupancy and use of the completed work following expiration of the Contract Time. The Contractor further

acknowledges and agrees that, if the Contractor fails to substantially, or cause the Substantial Completion of any portion of the Work within the Contract time, the Owner will sustain actual damages as a result of such failure. The exact amount of such damages will be difficult to ascertain. Therefore, the Owner and Contractor agree that, if the Contractor shall neglect, fail, or refuse to achieve substantial completion of the Work by the Substantial Completion date, subject to proper extension granted by the Owner, then the Contractor agrees to pay the Owner the sum of:

1. One thousand two hundred dollars (\$1200.00) per day for each day in which such Work is not completed, not as penalty, but as liquidated damages, for the damages ("Liquidated Damages") that would be suffered by Owner as a result of delay for each and every calendar day that the Contractor shall have failed to have completed the Work as required herein. The Liquidated Damages shall be in lieu of any and all other damages which may be incurred by Owner as a result of the failure of Contractor to complete within the Contract Time.

ARTICLE 5 - CONTRACT PRICE

- 5.01 Owner shall pay Contractor for completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents the amounts that follow, subject to adjustment under the Contract:
 - A. For all Unit Price Work, an amount equal to the sum of the extended prices (established for each separately identified item of Unit Price Work by multiplying the unit price times the actual quantity of that item):

As provided in Paragraph 13.03 of the General Conditions, estimated quantities are not guaranteed, and final determinations of actual quantities and classifications are to be made by Engineer.

ARTICLE 6 – PAYMENT PROCEDURES

- 6.01 Submittal and Processing of Payments
 - A. Contractor shall submit Applications for Payment in accordance with Article 15 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed by Engineer as provided in the General Conditions.
- 6.02 Progress Payments; Retainage
 - A. Owner shall make progress payments on account of the Contract Price on the basis of Contractor's Applications for Payment on or about the 30th day of each month during performance of the Work as provided in Paragraph 6.02.A.1 below, provided that such Applications for Payment have been submitted in a timely manner and otherwise meet the requirements of the Contract. All such payments will be measured by the Schedule of Values established as provided in the General Conditions (and in the case of Unit Price Work based

on the number of units completed) or, in the event there is no Schedule of Values, as provided elsewhere in the Contract.

- Prior to Substantial Completion, progress payments will be made in an amount equal to the percentage indicated below but, in each case, less the aggregate of payments previously made and less such amounts as Owner may withhold, including but not limited to liquidated damages, in accordance with the Contract
 - a. 95 percent of Work completed (with the balance being retainage); and
 - b. <u>95</u> percent of cost of materials and equipment not incorporated in the Work(with the balance being retainage).
- B. Upon Substantial Completion, Owner shall pay an amount sufficient to increase total payments to Contractor to the full amount of the contract, less such amounts set off by Owner pursuant to Paragraph 15.01.E of the General Conditions, and less such amounts as the Engineer shall determine for incomplete Work, retainage applicable to such work and unsettled claims.

6.03 Final Payment

A. Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions, Owner shall pay the remainder of the Contract Price as recommended by Engineer as provided in said Paragraph 15.06.

ARTICLE 7 – INTEREST

7.01 All amounts not paid when due shall bear interest at the maximum rate allowed by law, not to exceed 1% per month.

ARTICLE 8 – CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

- 8.01 In order to induce Owner to enter into this Contract, Contractor makes the following representations:
 - A. Contractor has examined and carefully studied the Contract Documents, and any data and reference items identified in the Contract Documents.
 - B. Contractor has visited the Site, conducted a thorough, alert visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with and is satisfied as to the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
 - C. Contractor is familiar with and is satisfied as to all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
 - D. Contractor has carefully studied all: (1) reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and all drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings, and (2) reports and drawings relating to Hazardous Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, especially with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
 - E. Contractor has considered the information known to Contractor itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Contract Documents; and the Site-related reports and drawings identified in the Contract Documents, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and documents on (1) the cost, progress, and performance of the

Unless expressly agreed to elsewhere in the Contract, no assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and, specifically but without limitation, money that may become due and money that is due may not be assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents.

10.03 Successors and Assigns

A. Owner and Contractor each binds itself, its successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the other party hereto, its successors, assigns, and legal representatives in respect to all covenants, agreements, and obligations contained in the Contract Documents.

10.04 Severability

A. Any provision or part of the Contract Documents held to be void or unenforceable under any Law or Regulation shall be deemed stricken, and all remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and binding upon Owner and Contractor, who agree that the Contract Documents shall be reformed to replace such stricken provision or part thereof with a valid and enforceable provision that comes as close as possible to expressing the intention of the stricken provision.

10.05 Contractor's Certifications

- A. Contractor certifies that it has not engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for or in executing the Contract. For the purposes of this Paragraph 10.05:
 - "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value likely to influence the action of a public official in the bidding process or in the Contract execution;
 - 2. "fraudulent practice" means an intentional misrepresentation of facts made (a) to influence the bidding process or the execution of the Contract to the detriment of Owner, (b) to establish Bid or Contract prices at artificial non-competitive levels, or (c) to deprive Owner of the benefits of free and open competition;
 - "collusive practice" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of Owner, a purpose of which is to establish Bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels; and
 - 4. "coercive practice" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the bidding process or affect

the execution of the Contract.

10.06 Other Provisions

A. City Council of the City of Schertz, Texas, authorizing a contract with AG|CM, Inc., for Owner's Representative Services related to the Woman Hollering Creek

Wastewater Project. (B. James/K. Woodlee)

BACKGROUND

The Woman Hollering Creek Wastewater Trunk Main and Lift Station Project (WHC WW Project) is part of the City's effort to establish and expand public wastewater collection and conveyance service to the southern portion of Schertz. The project generally consists of 13,000 linear feet (lf) of 30-inch diameter gravity main, 1,500 lf of 18-inch gravity main, 6,000 lf of 14-inch force main, and a wastewater lift station with 16-foot diameter storage and wet wells. Once constructed, the project will provide the backbone to a future system that will serve approximately 4,461 acres and 6,450 dwelling units in an area known as the WHC sewershed. The project will convey wastewater to the newly constructed CCMA water reclamation plant on Trainer Hale Road.

Construction of the WHC WW Project is expected to cost \$11,100,000 and will take 12 to 15 months to be fully complete. In order to ensure that construction is managed appropriately and that it is done in compliance with City and other applicable standards, and considering current workload, City staff must be augmented by qualified professional contractual assistance.

AG|CM has an existing master agreement to provide on-call owner's rep services on behalf of the City. This task order falls under the scope of the master agreement established and approved by council on resolution 19-R-112.

GOAL

The goal of the owner's representative contract is to provide the appropriate level of construction management and quality assurance through installation of the Woman Hollering Creek Wastewater trunk main, lift station, and forcemain (WHC Project). Management and inspection of the WHC Project will demand significantly more time than current city staff has available. By providing for contracted owner's rep services, the project can be managed more thoroughly and properly. AG|CM personnel will function on the WHC Project as an extension of staff resources during the construction period.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

The community benefits from having well run projects that are completed on-time and on-budget, to ensure that taxpayer funds are used responsibly. AG|CM will work for the city to accomplish those goals.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends Council approve Resolution 21-R-107.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding needed for the not to exceed amount of this agreement is \$333,000. That amount will be covered under the total funding for construction and ancillary tasks associated with the WHC WW Project. Total funding for the current construction effort comes from a combination of 2013 Bond Sales, Wastewater Capital Recovery Funds, and planned Future Bond Sales, and totals \$11,783,000.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends Council approve Resolution 21-R-107.

WHEREAS, City staff has determined that AG|CM, Inc., is an approved project management firm with the City, and is qualified to provide such owner's representative services for the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to enter into an Agreement with AG|CM, Inc., for a base amount of \$302,550, pursuant to the proposal attached hereto as Exhibit A ("Agreement").

The City Staff is recommending to renovate the Borgfeld Facility to

administrative space.

BACKGROUND

The Borgfeld facility was originally built in 1992 as the Schertz Kennel. In 2014, Animal Services relocated from the facility on Borgfeld to their new location on Community Circle. Since 2015, the facility has been empty and in need of repairs.

City Staff is currently in need of approximately 30,000 square feet for different functions across the City with an increasing demand on administrative space. Renovating the Borgfeld facility will provide at least 2400 square feet of administrative space with the opportunity for up to 5000 square feet of useable space.

The Staff is proposing to renovate the space using budgeted FY 21-22 operations and maintenance funds from the Public Works Budget for a cost of \$26.33/sqft. New construction of a similar sized facility is approximately \$300/sqft. The current total estimate to renovate the space is \$63,000.

Renovation costs are a significant savings over new construction costs and will provide much needed space for employees and services to the City of Schertz.

TxDOT Roadway Projects:

- **4. I-35 NEX** (**I-410 South to FM 1103**): A design-build contract for the central segment of the I-35 Northeast Expansion project has been awarded to Alamo NEX Construction. The central section runs from 410 N to FM 3009 is fully funded. A groundbreaking ceremony is scheduled for October 14, 2021. Significant construction is expected to begin in Spring 2022.
- 5. IH-10 Graytown Road to Guadalupe County Line: Construction of this \$157 million project to expand IH 10 underway. Traffic controls have been placed and work has begun on the transition of the access roads from two-way to one-way. Grading for the widening of the main lanes has also begun and utility relocations are underway. (No City of Schertz utilities need to be relocated for this project.) Ramp and lane closures take place as necessary and occasionally include full closure of the main lanes for work such as bridge demolitions. The construction timeline for the project is 53 months.
